2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Definitions

See <u>Definitions for Business Communications Services</u> which is incorporated into this Schedule by this reference.

2. Undertaking of the Carrier

SPRINT COMMUNICATIONS COMPANY L. P. is a specialized communications common carrier providing intercity communications channels of various bandwidths and data speeds designed to provide for transmission of voice, data, video and other dedicated service. Facilities are offered to meet the particular transmission needs of the subscriber. The Carrier stands ready to provide technical assistance to the subscriber to the extent of properly matching the subscriber's equipment with that of the Carrier, in order to help him meet his requirements for specialized communications service.

The facilities of the Carrier will be available as soon as practicable from receipt of an order for channels between any and all points on the Carrier's system, as licensed by the Federal Communications Commission. Interconnection of the Carrier's facilities with the facilities of other communications common carriers, with private systems, and with International Record Carriers ("IRC") will be permitted.

The obligation of the Carrier to provide service is dependent upon its ability to procure, construct, and maintain facilities which are required to meet the subscriber's order for service. The Carrier will make all reasonable efforts to secure the necessary facilities and will amend its schedule accordingly, providing such new service will not adversely affect the Carrier's present services.

3. Applicability of Standard Terms and Conditions

All terms and conditions in the Standard Terms and Conditions for Sprint Communications Services found at http://www.sprint.com/business/support/ratesWelcome.jsp apply to the Services provided under this schedule. Additional product-specific terms and conditions set forth in this schedule apply.

4. Limitations on Sprint's Obligation to Perform

Foreign Telecommunications Administrations may impose upon the portion of the end-toend international service they provide certain limitations, prohibitions or restrictions which may limit the ability of subscribers or their authorized users to utilize the services furnished by Sprint. It is the responsibility of the subscriber or its authorized user to conform to any limitations, prohibitions or restrictions imposed by the Foreign Telecommunications Administration.

Digital Private Line and Optical Private Line and Optical Private Line Services are offered subject to the availability of facilities.

5. Application for Service

Sprint may also require a signed authorization from a subscriber for additions to or changes in the existing service of such subscriber.

An application for service cancelled by the subscriber or the Carrier prior to the establishment of the service applied for is subject to the provisions of this section.

1. Cancellation of Application for Service

When the subscriber or applicant has requested the Carrier to cancel the application for service prior to service installation, cancellation charges will apply. Cancellation charges for both the underlying private line services and access will be based on the stage at which the Access Service Request ("ASR") is at, either the Pre-Access Service Request ("Pre-ASR") or the Post-Access Service Request ("Post-ASR") stage.

The Pre-ASR stage is when the ASR is complete but has not yet been sent to the Local Exchange Carrier ("LEC") or the Alternate Access Vendor ("AAV"). The Post-ASR stage is when the ASR is complete and has been sent to the LEC or AAV.

The amount of the cancellation charge will vary according to the category of service ordered and at which stage the cancellation occurred (Pre-ASR or Post-ASR). Category of services are (1) the Service Component based on IXC ordered and (2) the Access Component based on type of access ordered. See service component cancellation charges in this schedule and Schedule No. 8 for access component cancellation charges.

2. Change of an Application for Service

An Application for Service may be changed by Subscriber upon written notice to Sprint, subject to acceptance and confirmation by Sprint, provided that a charge shall apply to any change when the request is received by Sprint after notification by Sprint of the acceptance and confirmation.

Such charge shall be the sum of the charges and costs for Digital Private Line service incurred by Sprint in accommodating each change including the direct and indirect costs of facilities specifically provided or used; the costs of installation (including design preparation, engineering, supply expense, labor and supervision, general and administrative) and any other costs resulting from the preparation, installation and removal effort.

6. Payment of Charges

See <u>Additional Business Charges, Fees, Surcharges, and Taxes</u> which is incorporated into this Schedule by this reference.

7. <u>Interruption of Service</u>

It shall be the obligation of the subscriber to notify the Carrier of any interruption in service. Before giving such notice, the subscriber shall ascertain that the trouble is not being caused by action or omission of the subscriber, not within his control, or is not in wiring or equipment connected to the terminal of the Carrier.

8. Minimum Service Period

The minimum service period for Clearline Private Line Services is dependent upon the length of service commitment for which subscriber agrees. The minimum service term is 90 days for month-to-month domestic Clearline 1.5, Clearline Fractional 1.5, Clearline Voiceband and Clearline Digital Data services and one-year domestic Clearline 45 and for international Clearline services.

9. <u>Discontinuance of Service without Liability</u>

A customer will not be penalized for discontinuing a Clearline digital private line agreement if:

- A revision in the Clearline schedule provisions results in higher plan rates for the plan to which the customer has committed. The customer may request affected circuits be disconnected up to 30 days after the effective date of the higher schedule rates without penalty. Otherwise, the customer's existing agreement remains in effect and the new rates will be billed.
- 2. The customer selects a new plan having a longer term.

10. <u>Trouble Shooting at Subscriber's Premises</u>

This charge is to cover the cost to Carrier of a visit to subscriber's premises to determine what equipment is the cause of a malfunctioning channel. This charge applies in cases where Carrier identifies the trouble to be caused by subscriber-provided equipment and is unrelated to any malfunction of Carrier's service. The charge applies from the time Carrier personnel are dispatched until the problem is identified.

11. <u>Special Service Arrangements</u>

The rates and charges set forth in this schedule provide for furnishing service by means of facilities selected by the Carrier. Special service arrangements are involved where one or more of the following conditions are present:

- At the request of the subscriber, the Carrier provides service by means of facilities of a type other than that which the Carrier would otherwise utilize in order to provide service to the subscriber. This type of special service arrangement might involve subscriber-specified routing or expedited construction.
- At the request of the subscriber, the Carrier provides technical assistance of a design or consulting nature, beyond that of just properly matching subscriber's equipment with that of the Carrier's facilities.

12. Out-of-Hours Work Charge

This charge is to cover the additional costs incurred by the Carrier when performing standard schedule services outside of normal work hours. This charge applies to each hour expended rounded to the nearest half hour. It applies in addition to the standard schedule charges for the work requested.

13. <u>Telecommunications Service Priority (TSP) Provisioning and Restoration</u>

Sprint will arrange access service for provisioning and/or restoration priority on receipt of certification in conformance with Part 64, Subpart D, Appendix A of the Federal Communications Commission's Rules and Regulations. Rates are are provided under Schedule No. 8.

- 1. When an order for a TSP provisioning priority is received, a non-recurring charge per local channel will apply, as are provided under Schedule No. 8, Section 3.1.2.6.
- 2. When an order for a TSP restoration priority is received, monthly recurring and non-recurring charges per local channel will apply, as specified in Schedule No. 8, Section 3.1.2.6.
- If a restoration is discontinued, no charge will apply.

14. Mileage Between Points of Presence

The intercity mileages between the Carrier's points of presence where services are offered is calculated based on V and H (V&H) coordinates as obtained by reference to NECA Tariff F.C.C. No. 5.

The airline mileage between two carrier network terminal offices is calculated as follows:

- 1. Obtain the "V" and "H" coordinates for each Sprint POP. The "V" coordinate is the first four digits in the "VH" column. The "H" coordinate is the next four digits.
- 2. Obtain the difference between the "V" coordinates of each of the Sprint POPs. Obtain the difference between the "H" coordinates.
- 3. Square each difference obtained in step 2 above.

- 4. Add the square of the "V" difference and the "H" difference obtained in step 3 above.
- 5. Divide the sum of the squared numbers by 10. Round to the next higher whole number if any fraction is obtained.
- 6. Obtain the square root of the whole number result obtained in step 5 above. Round to the next higher whole number if any fraction is obtained. This is the airline mileage.

15. <u>Multi-Location Channel Mileage Calculation</u>

The intercity mileage for the interoffice segments on a digital private line service with multiple customer premises locations in multiple LATAs (potentially utilizing more than two points of presence), is the sum of the individual airline mileages measured between each pair of Sprint points of presence which produces the lowest total mileage charge when all of the Sprint points of presence are connected together.

Under no circumstances shall the Carrier be responsible for any direct, indirect, special, incidental or consequential damages arising directly or indirectly from the provision of service using such facilities, including without limitation any loss of Customer income or profits. The subscriber shall indemnify and hold harmless the Carrier from any and all claims, actions, costs, expenses and damages associated with or arising out of Customer's use of such facilities.

19. <u>Call Charges</u>

For the services set forth in this schedule, if the computed charge of a call includes a fraction of a cent, the fraction is rounded up to the next whole cent (e.g., \$1.244 is rounded up to \$1.25).

20. Technical Obligations

21. <u>Custom Network Service Arrangements, Custom Service Agreements, Master Services Agreements, and Other Specially Priced Sprint Agreements Terms and Conditions</u>
