Warnings and Cautions

Safety Warnings

- Even when receiving route guidance from the Navigation system, please abide by actual traffic and road regulations. Following only the Navigation route guidance may lead to violations of actual traffic and road regulations and lead to traffic accidents.
- Do not stare at the screen while driving. Staring at the screen for prolonged periods of time could lead to traffic accidents.
- Do not operate the Navigation system while driving, such as entering POIs or conducting route searches. Such acts could lead to accidents, fire, or electric shock. Park the vehicle before operating the device.
- Do not disassemble, assemble, or modify the Navigation system. Such acts could result in accidents, fire, or electric shock.
- Heed caution not to spill water or introduce foreign objects into the device. Such acts could lead to smoke, fire, or product malfunction.

- Please refrain from use if the screen is blank or no sound can be heard as these signs may indicate product malfunction. Continued use in such conditions could lead to accidents (fires, electric shock) or product malfunctions.



Turning the System On/Off

Turning the System On

If the engine start button is pressed without pressing the brakes, then the ACC and system will turn on.

Once the system is turned on, the booting process will start and the safety warning page is displayed.

Pressing the PWR key on the head unit will display the safety warning page. Press the Agree button to display the most recent mode.



To change the system language between Korean, English, Français, and Español press the Language button.

Information

 No operations are supported while the system is booting. Some time may be required until all features are ready for use.

A CAUTION

 The safety warning page is displayed every time the ignition is turned on. The displayed warnings are related to saftey, please closely read and comply with the safety warnings.

Turning the System Off

Press the engine start button again or press and hold the **●** PWR key on the system to turn the system off.

1 Information

- If the system is turned off while the Handsfree is being used, then the call will automatically switch back to the mobile phone.
- ADM (Accessory Delay Mode) refers to a state in which the navigation system will remain turned on for continued use up to a certain amount of time even if the vehicle ignition is set to ACC OFF state.
- The navigation system will automatically turn off if more than 3 minutes has passed in ACC OFF state or the driver-side door is opened.
- While ADM is operating, it is possible to manually turn off the system power.

A CAUTION

 Pay attention to the volume setting when turning the device on. Adjust the volume to a suitable levels before turning off the device.

Resetting the System

This feature is used to reset the system in the occurrence of an unforeseen error or problem.



Press and hold the RESET key. (about 1 second)

(The use of a clip or pin is recommended when resetting the system.)

NOTICE

 Upon resetting the system, saved data and settings information (radio frequencies, volume and display settings) will be restored back to the default factory state. Such are not indications of malfunctions.

When the power is OFF, pressing the **FM/AM** key will turn the power on and play a radio broadcast.

Using SEEK

Press the **SEEK** key to automatically search for frequencies.

- Shortly press the key (under 0.8 seconds) : Plays previous/next frequency.
- Press and hold the key (over 0.8 seconds) : Changes the frequency while pressed and receives the next frequency upon release.

Using TUNE

Press the **TUNE** key to manually select the frequency.



- FM1/FM2 : Increases/decreases by 200kHz
- · AM : Increases/decreases by 10kHz

Press the Auto Store to automatically save receivable frequencies to Preset buttons.

A total of 18 frequencies with six preset frequencies each for FM1/FM2/AM modes can be saved.

Scanning Radio Frequency



What is *Bluetooth®* Wireless Technology?

Precautions for Safe Driving

- Bluetooth[®] Handsfree is a feature that enables drivers to practice safe driving. Connecting the head unit with a Bluetooth[®] phone allows the user to conveniently make calls, receive calls, and manage the phone book. Before using *Bluetooth[®]* Wireless Technology, carefully read the contents of this user's manual.
- Excessive use or operations while driving may lead to negligent driving practices and be the cause of accidents. Do not operate the device excessively while driving.
- ▶ Viewing the screen for prolonged periods of time is dangerous and may lead to accidents. When driving, view the screen only for short periods of time.

CAUTIONS upon Connecting Bluetooth[®] Phone

Auto Crash Notification

Provides immediate assistance when an accident occurs and an airbag is deployed. In this event, an ACN signal, containing customer and location information, will automatically be transmitted to the response center. Upon receipt of the signal, a response specialist will attempt to establish voice communications with the vehicle occupants and forward any pertinent information to emergency services.



SOS

Customers request emergency 911 assistance by pressing the dedicated skey in the vehicle. This action transmits vehicle information and location to specially trained response specialists, who assist in coordinating the dispatch of appropriate emergency assistance to the customer.

The response specialist remains on the line with the customer until advised assistance has arrived.



Stolen Vehicle Recovery

In the event a customer's vehicle is reported stolen (and a stolen vehicle report has been filed with the appropriate police department), the response center can provide assistance to the police in an attempt to recover the vehicle.

Vehicle Immobilization

Used with Stolen Vehicle Recovery, this enables law enforcement to send a signal to the vehicle which immobilizes the engine management system, thus preventing startup. This capability is only valid when the ignition is off, but can be saved for later immobilization if the vehicle is on or in motion at the time of signal transmission.

Vehicle Slowdown

Used with Stolen Vehicle Recovery, this enables law enforcement to gradually reduce the engine power of the vehicle, thus slowing it down to safe levels. A warning shall be transmitted to the driver prior to the slowdown procedure.

About Pairing Mobile Phones

- Q I cannot pair my mobile phone. What is the cause?

- Q What is the difference between pairing a mobile phone and connecting a mobile phone?
- A Pairing occurs through authenticating the head unit and mobile phone. Mobile phones paired to the head unit can be connected and disconnected until the paired mobile phone is deleted from the system. - Automatic route recalculation (guidance) according to changes in traffic conditions.
- Provides short-cuts for initially searched routes.
- Displays increased detour distance and estimated driving times.
- Displays icons by each traffic situation on the map.
- 1. Calculation by Incorporating Actual Road Traffic Conditions.

Incorporation of traffic information to route calculations is a user option which can be turned on or off by the user.

2. Displays Road Traffic Situations.

RTM (Road Traffic Message) is a feature which displays symbols of icons for each type of road traffic condition, such as locations under construction, accidents, basic weather, and others on map locations based on traffic information provided by XM.

3. Avoidance of Locations Where Traffic Situations Have Occurred.

If a traffic situation occurs somewhere along the route, the route is recalculated to avoid such locations and an avoidance recalculation popup will be displayed.

4. Displays Traffic Event List.

A list providing details on accidents and an icon which will display the accident location are displayed. The user can view details by pressing on the list or move the map to the accident location by pressing on the accident icons.

Auto Crash Notification

Provides immediate assistance when an accident occurs and an airbag is deployed. In this event, an ACN signal, containing customer and location information, will automatically be transmitted to the response center. Upon receipt of the signal, a response specialist will attempt to establish voice communications with the vehicle occupants and forward any pertinent information to emergency services.

SOS

Customers request emergency 911 assistance by pressing the dedicated key in the vehicle. This action transmits vehicle information and location to specially trained response specialists, who assist in coordinating the dispatch of appropriate emergency assistance to the customer. The response specialist remains

on the line with the customer until advised assistance has arrived.

Stolen Vehicle Recovery

In the event a customer's vehicle is reported stolen (and a stolen vehicle report has been filed with the appropriate police department), the response center can provide assistance to the police in an attempt to recover the vehicle.

Vehicle Immobilization

Used with Stolen Vehicle Recovery, this enables law enforcement to send a signal to the vehicle which immobilizes the engine management system, thus preventing startup. This capability is only valid when the ignition is off, but can be saved for later immobilization if the vehicle is on or in motion at the time of signal transmission.

Vehicle Slowdown

Used with Stolen Vehicle Recovery, this enables law enforcement to gradually reduce the engine power of the vehicle, thus slowing it down to safe levels. A warning shall be transmitted to the driver prior to the slowdown procedure.
