Check it out

A request from Geordie Chapter Director **Barry Gillespie**

In 2012 I was diagnosed with localised prostate cancer. Don't worry, this isn't a request for sympathy or charity. But it's not necessarily an easy ask. I'm happy to share my experience to help others.

I am now on a scheme called Watchful Waiting. I have my PSA (Prostate-Specific Antigen) levels checked four times a year and I have to see a consultant urologist twice a year, to check that all is ok. Many localised cancers (like mine) are not aggressive and grow slowly. They do not cause any problems during your life time - you die with it, not because of it.

Prostate cancer is the second most common form of cancer in men. One in eight men at the age of 50 will suffer from it. All I want you to do is get yourself checked if you're around the 50-year mark. Go and see your doctor. It's just a simple blood test. Catch it quick. It's no good putting it off and finding out you have advanced prostate cancer. Who'll ride your Harley® then?! 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
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A roof slate from the home of the 19thcentury Davidsons has completed its epic journey to Sturgis

Two pieces of Harley-Davidson® history were brought together in June when a roof slate from Netherton Cottage, Scotland was presented to the mayor of Sturgis.

The slate had travelled some 4,000 miles: it was flown from Aberdeen, Scotland to Aberdeen, South Dakota, where it was passed to Matt and Brittney Olsen from 20th Century Racing. Matt and Brittney, along with a convoy of riders on Panheads and Knuckleheads, rode with the slate to its final destination.

Netherton Cottage, in the tiny village of Aberlemno in Angus, eastern Scotland, was the home of the Davidson family until they emigrated to the USA in 1857. William C. Davidson - father of William, Walter and Arthur, who founded the Motor Company - lived there as a child. The cottage was bought in 2008 by Mike Sinclair, Maggie Sherrit and Keith Mackintosh, who restored it to the way it would have looked in the 1850s. It is now a place of pilgrimage for H-D® enthusiasts from all over the world. Visitors can stay in the cottage and experience life as it would have been for the Davidson family in the 19th century although there is a separate block with showers and a modern kitchen for those

who prefer a few 21st-century comforts!

One of the original roof slates has been at the Harley-Davidson Museum™ in Milwaukee since 2010; the new Sturgis Harley-Davidson Plaza seemed a natural place for another. The plaza was officially opened on July 31, for the 75th anniversary of the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally. The slate bears the Harley-Davidson logo and the inscription: "Roofslate from the Scottish home of William C Davidson. Father of the founders, builder of The Shed, the first home of Harley-Davidson."

Visitors to the most famous motorcycle rally in the world can now see a reminder of the Motor Company's humble roots,



and of a family whose quest for a better life led them thousands of miles from home to Milwaukee, where William C. Davidson would build the first ever Harley-Davidson workshop for his three enterprising sons. ■





At the end of June I had the pleasure of taking part in the Dawn to Dusk One-Day Run, an east-to-west journey across England from Lowestoft to Lands End. Friday afternoon and evening saw the arrival of all the other 'Dawn to Duskers' and the organisers, Graham and Hilary, made sure everyone had been given their 2015 One-Day Run passport and bright green T-shirt. Participating on a Harley-Davidson® is the only prerequisite for this event and of the 33 participants, 12 were Ladies of

Harley[™] so it was good to see more rider and non-rider LOH taking part this year.

It's 4am on Saturday morning and with my bike loaded up, I sat in eager anticipation as I can hear other Harley-Davidsons leave another hotel just down the road. The excitement gathers as riders congregate at the easterly Ness Point. Our mileage is checked, our passports are stamped, photos are taken, Facebook is updated, the sun rises and then we're off on our chosen route! Spirits are high.

I recently upgraded from road numbers on paper stuck to my tank to using satnav and I had prepared a suitable A road route. For me, I choose to simply view the screen as I enjoy the time in the saddle of my Classic Springer, with no 'ear interruption' of GPS directions, music or linked intercom facility – simply a journey of 'helmet space'.

With four compulsory passport

checkpoints at Newmarket, Oxford, Bridgwater and Plymouth Harley-Davidson® dealerships, everyone takes their route of choice to see the sunset at Lands End – it's not a race. The early morning's empty roads make for easy and enjoyable riding; the air is crisp and fresh, the sun glistens in the rear-view mirror as it rises in the sky.

As each checkpoint, refuelling or food and drink break passes by it feels tiring yet invigorating at the same time. The regular stops make the journey much more manageable.

I believe that a totally non-motorway route has not been used before, so a chosen route that takes in glorious scenery, winding roads, historic towns, poppy fields, the Cotswolds and the Mendip Hills is quite an achievement. As such, my husband Ray and fellow riding buddies Neil and Helen enjoy it too.



The hardest part for me is the last part of the A30 dual carriageway, but seeing the signs for Lands End washes away any aches.

The last few miles are exhilarating and the sense of achievement is something to put a smile on my face as I ride through the remaining narrow Cornish roads.

To see Lands End with its whitewashed building and the vast ocean behind it is a 'whoop whoop!' and punch the air moment.

After 472 miles and just over 14 hours riding it was a proud experience to get the last passport stamp and be presented with my One-Day Run patch. I would recommend it to anyone; it is a truly fantastic day out.



CAPE 'EM COMING

Riding into the Arctic Circle had been a dream of ours for a long time, so when the opportunity arose last summer, we jumped at the chance. Three couples on three Electra Glides® set off from Peterborough and took the overnight ferry from Harwich to Esbjerg, Denmark. We rode the 190 miles to our Copenhagen hotel, leaving Denmark the next day via the five-mile-long Øresund Bridge. In Rättvik, we stayed in a log cabin - camping Nordic style!

Another 270 miles took us to the Swedish National H.O.G. Rally in Åre. The scenery was exceptional, with landscapes of greenery and millions of trees, broken by blue lakes and meandering rivers. After three days of hard riding in high temperatures, we used the two days at the rally to relax

and make use of the excellent facilities. Congratulations must go to the Jamtland Chapter for their brilliant choice of site, great organisation and friendliness.

We left Are early to go on to the Arctic Circle Centre in Krokstrand that evening. Light was not a problem as we were now getting continuous daylight, with the Centre remaining open until 10pm. The thermometer at the Centre was reading an unbelievable 30°C! After the unending trees in Sweden, we were now in a tundra landscape - bleak, but very beautiful in its own way.

We had decided to head west to the coast and ride the Atlanterhavsveien or Atlantic Road, one of the famous Norwegian National Tourist Routes. It is just over five miles long and links a number of islands and skerries with the

mainland using causeways, viaducts and eight bridges, the most spectacular being the Storseisundet Bridge. We made a quick visit to Trondheim Harley-Davidson® before following the E39 (ferry across Halsafjord) and Rv70 to Kristiansund to pick up the Atlantic Road (Rv64).

At the Jotunheimen National Park, we rode another of Norway's National Tourist Routes, the Sognefjellet Road, including the highest pass in northern Europe. Closed in the winter, this 108-kilometre road takes you past everything you could think of in the way of mountain scenery. There were rushing rivers and streams, waterfalls and glaciers on the high mountains; a winter wonderland with summer temperatures! Leaving the pass behind, we descended via several hairpin

bends to run along the beautiful Lustrafjord to our overnight stop at Sandvik Camping.

Our ride back south also took us through the world's longest road tunnel – complete with roundabout! We travelled the coastal route back to see more of rural Denmark before taking the ferry home. What a holiday! Brilliant company, wonderful scenery and fantastic riding for a grand total of 3,083 miles on our trusty Electra Glide.

SNOW FUN

Friday, January 30, 4am. My alarm goes off. My destination is perhaps a little unusual for motorcyclists at this time of year... I'd tried to find a travelling companion, but with no luck. Perhaps I'd make friends when I arrived.

Cities and highways pass quickly: Florence, Bologna, Padua, then Tarvisio, the last town before the Austrian border. As I continue on the motorway, it begins to snow. I slow down to 40kph but soon feel the front of the bike start to vibrate and suddenly find myself on the ground. I get up, I'm fine, two guys get out of their car to help me get the bike up. I get back in the saddle, turn on the engine and the bike starts straight away. Off I go again, more cautiously this time.

But a little way further on, it becomes apparent that all is not well with the bike. When I stop to check the damage, it won't start any more... Thanks to H.O.G. Assistance I arrange for the vehicle to be taken away, and I find a place to spend the night. It's not looking good for my trip.

At Harley-Davidson Pordenone the next day, I'm told my bike is back in working order. I'm at a crossroads. To the right, it's 500km home to Livorno; to the left, 250km to my destination, Tauerntreffen, the annual winter meeting in the Austrian mountains. I turn the wheel to the left. Onwards and upwards!

As darkness falls, at the last town before the foot of the mountain, I stop for the night. I'm a day late, but I'm only 8km from my goal: Tauerntreffen 2015!

It's a long 8km uphill in the snow in the early morning, but I finally see a square where bikes are parked. Bikers from Austria, Germany, Italy, France, even Turkey, hearts and engines united by the love of the road, the will to have fun and be together.

At 10am I already have to start my journey home. Like magic, as I set off the first flakes of snow begin to fall. **Lorenzo de Felice, Italy**

RALLY ROUND

From its beginnings with only 30 members, the Namibia Chapter has grown to more than 70 today, and is increasingly multicultural. The chapter's first official rally attracted more than 350 registered H-D® owners and passengers from Namibia and all over >



Southern Africa. They even had a Harley® as a raffle prize!

Namibia has 44,500km of roads, but only 6,600km are tarred – the rest are gravel roads. But that doesn't stop the Namibians doing regular ride-outs. En route to the rally site, we left Windhoek, the capital, and did 360km on an almost straight road. First we passed through a bushy area with trees, then savannah, a moon-like region of sand and dunes; and suddenly we were in a 'little Germany', the town of Swakopmund where the rally was held. There are 30,000 Namibians who speak German as their mother tongue; most live the German way of life, sometimes even more traditional than in Germany. Pork knuckle and sauerkraut, egg salad Broetchens, German TV; and when you ask them when they were last in Germany, they may well tell you they have never been there!

Guests enjoyed three days of entertainment and activities including biker games and an impressive mass ride between dunes and the Atlantic Ocean. But the highlight for many was the visit to Hanganeni Primary School in the township of Mondesa, and the handover of food and a cheque to the value of about €2,000 for the school to build its own soup kitchen and dining room.

Namibia is the 34th biggest country in the world and the second most sparsely populated. Of Windhoek's 300,000 inhabitants, 60 per cent live in Katutura, a township 8km north of the capital. Katutura means 'the place where people do not want to live'. It was created in 1961 following the forced removal of Windhoek's black population. Although apartheid was abolished in Namibia in 1975, differences in living standards are still very visible.

Primary schooling in Namibia is compulsory and free, but getting to school is often a challenge: the walk can be long, dangerous and unpleasant since many children do not have proper clothing and often go barefoot. A good reason to come to school is that many offer a meal at least once a day, something that is not a guarantee in every household. These food programmes are funded by charitable donations.

When the children of Hanganeni School sang and danced for us in appreciation, everybody felt proud to be a member of H.O.G.®, an organisation which, with co-ordinated effort, can help others. 'Ride and have fun', absolutely.

But it's even better to help others have some fun too!

After visits to the NASA Space Center

and the lively city of Austin, I found myself in Fredericksburg. Founded by German settlers centuries ago, this town was a surprise: touristy and full of bikers! Passing through the vast, desolate landscapes of Texas and New Mexico. I reached Albuquerque where I was at last breathing the air of Route 66.

So many world-famous places: the San Francisco Peaks, the Grand Canyon, Las Vegas. Approaching Los Angeles, everything changed: lush vegetation, the maze of streets and overpasses, the frenetic rhythms of the motorway. Finally, the vast Pacific Ocean, after 19 days of sensations, colours and scents that will remain forever in the library of my memories.





BANG FOR **Garry Stuart reports**

from a ram-jammed bank holiday weekend of bands, bikes and beautiful scenery at Ireland BikeFest

Review Judging by the numerous H.O.G.® patches on show from all over Europe, the word is getting out about one of the UK and Ireland's greatest motorcycle events, Ireland BikeFest.

The event began in 2006 when H.O.G. staged their 15th Euro Rally in Killarney in south-west Ireland – its popularity birthing a new event in its own right. Since then, the event has gone from strength to strength, first drawing in riders from around the island, then the rest of the British Isles and, increasingly, from around Europe and further afield - open to all two- and three-wheelers over the Irish Bank Holiday weekend at the beginning of June.

Harley-Davidson® UK and Ireland are big supporters of the event along with Irish authorised Harley-Davidson Dealerships, Waterford and Dublin H-D® and their associated Celtic Thunder and Gaelic H.O.G. Chapters.

DEEP POCKETS

The grounds of the Brehon and Gleneagles Hotels are the centre of festivities where all the music venues, caterers, traders' village and Harley® Demo Rides are situated. Admission to the site and all live entertainment, which begins at lunchtime and continues into the early hours, is all totally FREE! You pay for your ferry, food and accommodation and that's it.

The thrum of Harleys riding to and fro, the smell of the hog roast and the hard rockin' rhythms of the bands creates a priceless atmosphere - truly unique to the festival.

SETTING THE SCENE

There are other compelling reasons to make this your destination next year - those being the astounding natural scenery of mountains, lakes, forests and the wild Atlantic coastline, all within a short ride-out from Killarney.







The town itself is an idyllic traditional Irish locale, where the friendliness of the locals is legendary and the Guinness is just as good as they say.

The Cork and Kerry mountains to the south and west are the highest peaks in Ireland and the roads were made for touring motorcycles. This is the first and biggest National Park in Ireland into which the Gaelic and Celtic Thunder H.O.G. Chapters led ride-outs along a choice of routes. This year the Friday ride-outs were blessed with sunshine and blue skies while on Saturday the mountains were shrouded in mist and drizzle - though no less





enchanting. Harley-Davidson's Demo Ride Team were present with a full range of Harleys to choose from. They ran at capacity for three days solid - exceeding their previous performance for number of demo rides delivered. IBF is open to riders of all marques. Often having never ridden one before, it's great to see riders wearing Yamaha, Honda and BMW logos as they finish their demo rides, smiling like the cat that got the cream.

MUSIC TO OUR EARS

When the first band took to the outdoor stage in front of the Harley Bar in the warm afternoon sunshine, all of the outdoor tables and seats were occupied as rally goers took full advantage of the choice of food vendors available and a good range of locally brewed beer.

As the first few chords of the Steve Earle classic *Copperhead Road* echoed around the arena the local band Oracle perfectly set the scene for a weekend of music that ranged from traditional Irish folk and Celtic rock through to pop and heavy metal. The event boasts at least four stages, including the large INEC venue that could and did hold thousands of music fans. Hard to pick a highlight from such consistently great



performances, but personal highlights include Welsh covers band Devious (well-known regulars on the European Harley scene and for good reason) who put on one hell of a show whipping up a frenzy to a packed beer tent. Later on that night, AC/DC tribute band Hells Bells absolutely rocked the fully packed INEC Arena with an ear-splitting head banging non-stop assault of AC/DC classics. They really looked and sounded like the real deal.

TOP DOGS

Running alongside the BikeFest was the Killarney Tattoo Convention at the Gleneagles Hotel where many international tattoo artists were demonstrating their art, which was a great idea given that bikers are not averse to a tattoo or two! Whoever thought of the Ireland BikeFest Dog Show deserves a medal for outside-the-box thinking; surely a first for a biker event! The show was very popular, especially with the kids.

There were dozens of entrants ranging from a huge St Bernard to a tiny chihuahua. This was also free and open to the public which, along with all of the other attractions, guaranteed a great range of local people and tourists alike got to enjoy a slice of our lives. Most of the dog owners embraced the BikeFest by raiding the T-shirt vendors for biker neckerchiefs and bandanas to tie around their pooches' necks.

ON PARADE

Sunday's Grand Parade is always a spectacle to behold as it rumbles through the streets of Killarney. Due to tour the town's streets at 11am, the crowds were already lining the whole route an hour before the bikes were due, in order to get a good position from which to watch. It's plain to see how much the public enjoy seeing so many bikes of various types. Many of the shops in Killarney had prepared motorcycle-themed window displays – further demonstrating how much the locals love the bikers' annual visits.

CUSTOM BIKE SHOW

The Custom Bike show is always held on the well-manicured lawns of The Brehon Hotel. It is a well-supported show and it was

immediately clear that the standard of custom bikes entered was very high: winning a trophy here really means something. There were many categories to be judged:
Streetfighters, Classic British, Best Harley, Radical Chopper, Best Paint and many more all hotly contested. The judges' choice of Best In Show was shared by almost everyone present: a Bobber Harley called Ruby, hand built to exacting standards by local man Patsy McArdle. The quality of the finishing had to be seen to be believed. It is not very often that a Best In Show stands out so much over the many other great custom bikes entered.

MUSCULAR DYSTROPHY IRELAND

As with so many biker events, charities are grateful recipients of monies raised. For Ireland BikeFest, Muscular Dystrophy Ireland was the chosen benefactor. Collections were made all weekend, but the real money-raiser was the raffling of a Harley Sportster Iron. Tickets were only fives euros each and the lucky winner was local lad Paudie Mangan of Coolcorcoran.

WHAT THEY SAID

"This was my first time ever riding a Harley. It was very easy going with nice power delivery up to 100kph and I was surprised at the torque of it. Maybe down the road I will get a Harley, probably a Road King."

"The best thing for me about IBF is the mountain riding with great views that you can harldy imagine coming from a

flat country like Finland."

"What I like best about this rally are the people of Killarney and having the 'craic' with them, as they say here. Everyone is so friendly, the pubs are great and best of all is the amount of traditional Irish folk music being played in every bar."

"There's a very high standard of bikes here at the Custom Bike Show. One bike in particular caught my eye – 'Ruby'. I think it is a real contender for the Best In Show award, the workmanship and finish is top class."

"This is my first time at IBF and my first visit to Ireland. I came on my Honda and my dad came on his Harley-Davidson – which he won't let me ride. This demo is my first time riding a Harley. It was a totally different experience to anything I've ever ridden, really comfortable and really smooth. I came back with a big grin on my face, I really enjoyed it."

Wake the Lakes Festival 2015

Review This year, for the first time, Red Rose Chapter's popular Wake the Lakes Rally became the Wake the Lakes Festival and took over a new venue in the heart of the town of Kendal, Cumbria.

If you missed the full story in the July edition of the eMag, Red Rose Chapter's Editor Martin Wyatt gives us an overview of Wake the Lakes.

"From Thursday July 2, the Brewery Arts Centre rang to the sound of V-twins as it was invaded by over 450 H.O.G." members from the length and breadth of the UK, with riders coming from London, Scotland and Ireland, and everywhere in between. There were even some riders from Le Touquet, France.

"Wake the Lakes certainly lived up to its name as a riding event, with four ride-outs on Friday and the sun shining as over 100 bikes took to the Lake District roads on the guided tours. Routes included the beautiful Newlands Valley in the north of the county, the lesser-known South Cumbria lanes and a raid on the formidable Hardknott Pass, the steepest road in England. "The entertainment started on Thursday with the rock trio Tin Pan Alley playing at Bootleggers music venue, before continuing through the weekend at the Arts Centre, with its bars, cafés and restaurants. Bands included top female rock group JoanOvArc and a Bruce Springsteen tribute band.

"Saturday's Parade ride saw riders depart from the Art Centre's car park and ride through the middle of Kendal while locals cheered and waved. The ride continued north over Shap Fell, then back via Ullswater, Windermere and Bowness. There were too many bikes on the run to count, but estimates were well over a hundred riders enjoyed the views despite the showery weather. The sight of all those

beautiful machines riding through Bowness-on-Windermere stopped everyone in their tracks.

"The Arts Centre was open to the public during the event, and they mingled with H.O.G. members in the bars and cafés, looked at the bikes and enjoyed the music at the outside stage.

"The custom show saw some spectacular custom bikes, including a bagger with a huge front wheel, and several hard-tail chops, one with some beautiful engraving on the metalwork.

"Red Rose Chapter members helping at the event reported many compliments, particularly about the ride-outs, with one attendee saying it was his best in 20 years! Others commented on the friendliness of Red Rose members and the locals – Kendal really took H.O.G. and Harley-Davidson® to its heart, and many people said how much they'd enjoyed our visit."

We're certainly looking forward to going back next year! ■








HOG® magazine discovers the story behind Bari Vecchia, 'Best in Show' winner at the Custom Bike Show at this year's Harley-Davidson® Euro Festival

Gianluca Giuliani had a vision: a vision of an old bike, restored and perfected using old-fashioned tools, and decorated to celebrate his attachment to his family's home city of Bari.

Luckily, Gianluca works in marketing and merchandising for one of Italy's most exciting custom builders – Punto Di Fuga (PDF) in Bergamo – so he set to work enlisting the help of his cohorts to help make his vision a reality.

I catch up with Gianluca at PDF's stall at the Euro Festival – the party is in full swing as the team celebrates its victory. One of the 'ragazzi' is DJing on the decks, another is apron-clad and providing ever more bread and meat to the buffet table, while the others mingle with the public and dance with abandon.

Despite the merriment reverberating around us, Gianluca is more than happy to sit back and talk bike. So how did the idea of the Bari Vecchia motorcycle come about, I ask him? "I used to joke with the other guys at PDF that they were 'outsiders', as the headquarters is located outside the Bergamo city walls," Gianluca recalls. "Because my family is from Bari, down in the Puglia region of southern Italy, they nicknamed me 'Bari Vecchia',

which is the old district of the city. As such, I came upon the idea of celebrating my heritage by creating a custom Harley® that represents my roots."

Gianluca is relatively young in years, and younger still in spirit; his exuberance and passion are infectious. So why the sobriquet 'Vecchia' (meaning 'old')?

"I just adore old bikes. I can feel the engine more with an old bike than with a modern one; no fancy electronics, just me and my machine. I can understand an old bike, almost like a living being; it's easier to hear and diagnose any issues with the engine."

The starting point was a 1938 EL 1000 and its Knucklehead engine, one of the earliest examples of the first Harley-Davidson® overhead-valve engine, which was introduced in 1936. The styling cues were heavily influenced by the spirit of a 1940s-1950s racer, with nods to trends from both British and American motorcycles of the era. The low, downward-pointing handlebars naturally encourage the rider into a streamlined racing position, evoking thoughts of the halcyon days of board-track racing.

So what techniques were employed in the creation of such a stunningly detailed machine? "The whole bike was created in >

WHO ARE PUNTO DI FUGA?

As well as being a hive of custom-building activity, the Punto di Fuga workshop in Bergamo is also the home of a burgeoning social scene; custom enthusiasts and members of the general public frequently visit for the evening entertainment. Every Thursday the workshop opens for a social evening, where friends can meet for a chat over a beer with live music in the background. Friday is 'Argentine Tango' night, celebrating the passion and intensity of the legendary South American dance, with an all-night buffet for refuelling.

"We're a passionate group of motorbike enthusiasts," says Gianluca, "and the older the bikes, the better! We hold gatherings and small concerts on the premises for the passionate few who come and find us. We're driven by our devotion, and never follow the fads that come and go. We're in it for the duration."

the PDF workshop – everything apart from the paint spraying was done here," enthuses Gianluca. "We had no help from any kind of new machinery like numerical control or anything like that, just an old lathe, our welding machines and our passion."

Led by foreman Matteo Fustinone, the team applied itself with meticulous attention to detail. Let's start with the paint job: Cisco, a talented custom painter from Cesate near Milan, completed the painting, airbrushing and pinstriping, before covering the fuel tank, oil tank and rear mudguard with a transparent coat. This allowed brass wire to be hand-applied to these areas, with the additional transparent layer ensuring a smooth finish. Additionally, the veneer that runs down the fuel tank was created from the wood of an olive tree from the Puglia region. Despite its heavily modified appearance, the fuel tank was actually an original Harley-Davidson® part, but hollowed out to accommodate the distinctive 'Knucklehead' rocker boxes.

Notice the medallion on the oil tank (see previous page) – this dates back to the 19th century, and depicts St Nicholas, the patron saint of Bari. Gianluca was very keen to include this on the bike, and went to a lot of time and trouble to locate it.

Having scooped the top prize at its first major event, Gianluca is looking forward to trying to acquire more accolades for his magnificent machine. "We're going to a number of bike shows in Italy, as well as some of the major European ones, before ending our tour at the EICMA custom show in Milan in November. We're also going to take part in the qualifier for the

2015 AMD World Championship. We managed to come seventh in the 'Retro Mod Class' last year with our 'Hazard' bike; this year we hope to go higher."

Gianluca talks excitedly about his victory at the Euro Festival: "It's always a pleasure to be appreciated for your work on a motorcycle: those long winter months spent in search of the pieces, group discussions on how to proceed, and then the painstaking realisation. Winning Best in Show at the H-D® Euro Festival is confirmation that the workshop and its staff are growing together, in harmony with the tastes of the judges and the outside world. We are genuinely touched by every compliment, every award and every magazine article. It's always difficult to emerge victorious in an environment where almost everything has already been thought of, but we did it!"

Looking at the glint in Gianluca's eye and the spectacular machine in front of him, one can only expect the awards to keep rolling in for Punto di Fuga.



MAD ABUT

George 'Mad Dog' McGuire, H.O.G.® chapter events co-ordinator for Great Britain, has come a long way since buying his first H-D® motorcycle in 1999 >







George 'Mad Dog' McGuire is a pretty busy man. Since 2003, he has been rally co-ordinator for the huge Thunder in the Glens rally, which has grown over the years to become one of the biggest H.O.G.® events in Europe. The annual extravaganza is currently preparing for its 19th year in the stunning ski-resort scenery of Aviemore. With a packed programme of ride-outs and entertainment, and visitors expected from all over the world, there's a lot to keep track of.

It's all part of the H.O.G. lifestyle that 'Mad Dog' has built for himself since buying his first Harley® some 16 years ago. A member of Scotland's first and original H.O.G.-affiliated Dunedin Chapter since that day in 1999, George is also currently the national chapter events co-ordinator for H.O.G. in the UK.

The roots of his passion, though, lie deeper in the past. George, now 60, was a youngster in Scotland when the iconic 'searching for America' road movie *Easy Rider* came out in UK cinemas back in 1969. Like so many others of his age, his imagination was captured by the flames and stars-and-stripes paintwork and fishtail-pipe rumble of the brash Harley-Davidson® Panhead choppers ridden by Captain America and Billy.

"I knew kids on my street that had British bikes," remembers George, "but I never forgot seeing those Harleys and their riders. That was the start for me. The bikes were iconic, and they said a lot about the individuals who chose to ride them, just enjoying the journey, having fun. I was penniless at the time, and my

father refused to let me have a motorcycle, so it just remained an ambition." But something had clicked in George's mind – he wanted a Harley-Davidson®, one day.

That day came 30 years later in 1999, as George found himself browsing round the showroom floor of the then Harley dealer Alvins of Edinburgh. "I didn't even have a bike licence, but I couldn't stop looking at the last Evo they had on the floor, a Heritage Softail®. I did at last have a bit of money, which in a twist of fate had been left to me after my father died. The salesman even offered to throw in free lessons, so I had no excuse – I decided to finally buy my own Harley."

When George met his wife Lorraine, she was initially unimpressed when he told her of his passion for bikes. It didn't take long to convince her, though: "She was hooked on Harley the minute she saw mine close up!"





Lorraine now rides a Sportster® 883, and grandson Harry already has his own electric H-D at the age of two, so Harleys run in the family. George himself has owned several Electra Glides® over the years, his current one being a 2008 model that he bought with just 1,000 miles under its wheels.

However, he also still owns his first Harley, having put many tens of thousands of miles on its clock. It's now adorned with custom paintwork commemorating historic British army regiment the Cameron Highlanders and the Battle of Prestonpans of 1745, in which a Scottish uprising defeated the British army. "After



all, my Harley is a Heritage Softail, so I felt inspired to put some of my heritage on it as well!" he grins.

Pride in his Scottish heritage shows through in George's other choice of pastime, too: he plays the bagpipes. Although he admits he mainly plays in his garage, he has performed at a couple of friends' weddings in the USA.

George might be nicknamed Mad Dog, but he's happy to admit it wasn't for some shady past misdemeanours! When George rode his new Harley proudly to work in August 1999, the sight and sound of him arriving on his iron steed inspired a colleague to name him Mad Dog, and the name has simply stuck. "I'd ride to work regularly, setting off car alarms in the car park, and everyone knew what time I started and left work!"

Perhaps 'Dark Horse' would also be another apt name for George, who, despite a busy 40-year career as a civil servant in education and learning from which he has recently retired, also reveals a fascinating past as a football referee and linesman. He has officiated at matches at the highest level, including the 'Old Firm' Rangers v Celtic clash, and a game at the Santiago Bernabéu between Real Madrid and Vitesse Arnhem.

"I didn't have time

to ride bikes.

Lwas too

busy keeping fit and running around," he laughs.

The outdoor life clearly suits George. For the past 10 years, when not on one of his Harleys, he has been driving another vehicle that's all about adventure: a Jeep. "I bought the Grand Cherokee Overlander Jeep for the same reasons I bought a Harley-Davidson. I saw it as an iconic machine, rugged, and individual to its owner."

These parallels are what led to the ongoing partnership between Jeep and Harley-Davidson; and George's Grand Cherokee has come in handy when the weather isn't great for riding: "Over 10 years of ownership it has been utterly reliable. It was particularly ideal in the two or three severe winters we had up here in Scotland recently."

Jeep will be strengthening its links with Harley-Davidson this August through its sponsorship of Thunder in the Glens – a pairing George is pleased about.

"Thinking about Jeeps and their connection with Harley, the freedom and individuality they represent, it feels like a good match," he explains.

Forty years after he first watched the opening scenes of *Easy Rider*, George owns his longed-for Harley-Davidson; but more than that, Harley-Davidson and its H.O.G. family have become a much larger part of his life than he could ever have envisaged. "When I bought the Harley I was never sure where it would lead; when I joined H.O.G. I never thought it would lead me to the places it has taken me. Having a Harley and being a H.O.G. member gets you out and about. After all, you only get one stab at life."

And though George isn't the kind of person who would suffer the description 'celebrity', his status after years of dedication and involvement with H.O.G. and the Dunedin Chapter is such that his network of H.O.G. friends now

extends throughout the world.

"I was drinking in a bar in the
States one time," recalls George,
"and someone came up to me
and recognised the Dunedin
H.O.G. patch I was wearing
on my back. He asked if he
could buy me a beer – I
replied 'very kind of you',
and he replied 'I meant buy
you a beer all night!'."

Frank Sander discusses the physics and aesthetics of the trend for everincreasing wheel sizes



BIG WHEELERS



In the beginning, a wheel was a means to an end and was installed on bikes solely for the purpose of movement. The industry quickly realised that wheels also represent a good design element, so Harley-Davidson® installed spoked wheels of various designs, until disc wheels and designer wheels were finally also introduced.

In the 1970s, rear tyres started to become wider as customisers turned to automobile tyres, which resulted in questionable handling, but the diameters remained the same.

In the 1990s, rear tyres became dramatically wider until a limit was reached some time in the 2000s. Not only was this quite disproportionate to the bike, but it was only a design feature – as was already the case with the automobile tyres – making them almost unrideable with widths of up to 360mm. Thus, the subject of wide tyres was exhausted and a new idea was required.

A trend for ever-larger rims, originally

seen in car customisation, arrived in the custom bike world. Initially, there were a few Touring bikes with 23" wheel rims, which could be accommodated in the standard forks without any additional modifications. A new front fender was fitted, and the bike looked cool without detracting from everyday suitability.

Along with the trend of refining Touring models, an idea from the US was then used to produce a 26" front tyre, but it didn't take long before they concluded that a 26" front rim would not fit in a H-D® Touring bike without massive modifications. The the first baggers were therefore modified with adventurous constructions on the frame and the fork, until professional customisers joined the trend. The first rims that were fitted in the USA had not received any European approval, but a new trend was born. The first conversions then emerged in Europe; they handled quite decently, contrary to initial opinions,

but no approved parts were yet available.

Meanwhile, well-known H-D dealers such as Thunderbike and Rick's developed fork yokes (also known as triple trees), for which the frame did not need to be modified, and which received European approval thanks to the sensible calculation of the angles involved. Wheels with large diameters were also produced in Europe; these were then installed not only in the Touring bikes, but also in Softail® and even Sportster® models.

There is no point in discussing the logic and there's no accounting for taste, as diversity is what customising is all about. This got the ball (or, shall we say, the wheel) rolling, awakening the wish for more. So one tyre manufacturer produced a 30" front tyre, which was immediately ordered by the customisers, and it was also clear here that the dimensions of the bikes had to be dramatically revised once again, to find technical and visual harmony.

The first bike with a hub-free 30" front wheel appeared in the United Arab Emirates, and the first bikes could also be admired at the bike shows in Europe a few weeks after the tyre appeared. The normal law of physics states that the larger the wheel the higher the gyroscopic force, so, accordingly, these bikes have very good directional stability, but in order for them to drive a clean radius around bends, they require a much higher level of force in the curves. In addition, the normal wheel diameter must be retained at the back. They are driveable, but it's borderline!

As is the case with all trends there are hardly any upward limits, so one sees bikes that drive on 30" wheels on the front and back and, currently, custom bikes are being prepared for 32" wheels. It remains to be seen where this trend will end; in all probability there will be a few more design gaffes but exciting new ideas can also be expected. The question of whether these bikes will really be able to move sensibly will be revealed when they are brought to the bike shows under their own power.






HOW DO I KNOW MY GEAR IS THE REAL THING?

If you're worried about falling prey to dodgy sites selling rip-off goods, there are some simple things you can do.

- 1. Only buy from authorised Harley-Davidson dealers - they have the exclusive rights to sell our MotorClothes® products.
- **2. Look out** for the security sticker found on all MotorClothes since 2011. These stickers have a textured, bumpy surface and feature a unique eight-digit code beginning with A (accessories), S (sportswear) or R (riding gear).
- **3. Look for** spelling mistakes! It's surprising how often counterfeit goods contain errors in logos or on their websites. If you find you're about to buy a 'Harly Davidsson ridding jacket', you'll probably want to think again.

WIND IT DOWN

When high winds hit, dial it down and go with the flow



As a writer for *HOG*® magazine, I've logged more than a few miles riding in high winds. The most dramatic example probably came last spring in Death Valley. Riding back into Furnace Creek from a few of the valley's hot spots (pun intended), we saw an immense wall of dust forming in the valley to our left – headed directly into our path. We already had been leaning hard into the crosswinds, but when the dust hit us we felt literally sandblasted for a few minutes. Shortly thereafter we stopped

for fuel, and it was still so windy we had trouble staying steady while we filled up.

Through these and other experiences, here's the main thing I've learned: *high winds are really no big deal*.

Relax, don't do it

Now let me qualify that statement. They're not a big deal if you know how to handle them. And the key is don't overreact. Stay calm, stay relaxed, and don't fight too hard.

For one thing, remember that you're

riding a Harley-Davidson® motorcycle, which is tested in a myriad of real-world testing environments, and that's a good place to start.

In a steady crosswind, if you stay relaxed – don't tighten up, don't fight it – you can ride a long way in a heavy lean without even noticing. That has been my experience, anyway. Yes, things get trickier when a big gust hits you, but the same principles apply. Stay relaxed.

The worst thing you can do is suddenly

jerk the handlebar to try to counteract the effects. Remember your countersteering principles! When you turn the handlebar one way, the bike tries to lean, and turn, to the other - exactly where you don't want to go in this situation.

When a gust hits you, push on the handlebar in the direction the wind is coming from – but do it gently! Don't jerk. It won't take much to correct your course. Let the weight of the bike and its inertial forces be your anchor in the wind.

Prime position

Another principle to remember is good lane positioning. When you're riding by yourself, you might want to consider riding more in the centre of the lane to give yourself a little more cushion. I just told you the wind probably won't move you around as much

react to objects or debris that may blow across the road. Be extra alert to this possibility, scanning the area ahead for things that could suddenly appear in your path.

Back to the bike

The kind of motorcycle you're riding - or how it's equipped - can make a difference in how the wind affects you. The larger the profile the more it will catch the wind, but the same principles apply. Stay relaxed. Remember your countersteering. Don't overreact.

A fairing or windshield is great for keeping the wind off you in normal conditions but can also catch more air in a crosswind. And even wheel choice can be a factor. These things aren't bad or good, just factors to consider.

miscellaneous items strapped to the bike, make extra sure that they're secure. A bag that sits solidly strapped to your passenger seat under 'normal' conditions may be vulnerable to shifting left or right in a strong crosswind.

Top gear

Finally, wearing the right gear will help make your windy ride more pleasant.

Windy conditions kick up more dust and dirt, so don't skimp on eye protection. A full-face helmet or face screen (on a three-quarter helmet) works great. Sealed goggles offer the best protection without a face screen. If you're committed to wearing just sunglasses, make sure they have shatter-resistant lenses – but remember, sunglasses leave lots of opportunity for dirt, dust, sand or even small pebbles to

as you think, but it's good to have more space to manoeuvre nonetheless.

This is especially true on a two-lane road. Speaking for myself, I hate being in the third of a lane closest to the centre of the road when there are big lorries coming in the other direction. I'll often move over to the opposite side of the lane to avoid their big wind wash - which often feels like it wants to *suck* you into oncoming traffic.

Keep in mind, however, the road conditions. The centre of the lane can be more slippery than the outer two-thirds, especially if it's wet. And if it's windy and rainy, that's probably a good time to find a bridge or some other place to wait it out for a while.

If you're riding in a group or with another rider, give yourself the following distance you need to ride in a way that you're comfortable with. More following distance will also give you more time to

In any of these situations, again, the solution is the same. The key is to know your motorcycle and know what to expect when the wind kicks up. Don't let any of these factors catch you off guard.

Riding position can also make a difference. A more 'active' position, with your feet underneath you, your body leaned slightly forward, and your hands comfortably forward, gives you greater control than a more relaxed position. 'Feet forward, hands in the air and ass on the ground' looks cool, and many find it very comfortable. But keep in mind that you won't be able to react as well in high winds.

You may even consider leaning forward, tight against the bike, to reduce your profile, and sometimes shifting your weight slightly toward the direction of the wind can help keep you more stable.

Finally, if you have any bags or

blow into your eyes from the side.

In windy conditions, it's often wise to cover your nose and mouth as well. A simple bandana can do wonders to keep your lips from drying out (or at least slow the process), and keep dust and dirt out of your nose.

Finally, cover your skin completely: long sleeves, over-the-ankle boots, a scarf around your neck - anything to keep the wind off, and the dust and dirt out.

As usual, dealing with high winds is about reducing the risks involved, not eliminating them. If ever the wind gets so high it puts you outside of your comfort zone, don't ride. It's always better to swallow your pride and be safe than let it put you in a dangerous situation. ■
