
 The Fearing Hall renovation has begun its final phase. Sheet-rocking, painting, flooring, tech & furniture ordering will be happening over the next several weeks.



Plan on being a part of this celebration of God's great faithfulness to Liberty for over 200 years.




ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 26

Many of the families who receive a Thanksgiving Box also participate in our annual Adopt-a-Family ministry. This year, Liberty provided Christ-

mas gifts to 122 adults and 190 children, in partnership with Delaware County Jobs & Family Services, Strengthening Families, and Equitas Health. Members of the Liberty community joined together to adopt families and do some extra Christmas shopping. Seeing the shopping lists was humbling—many people asked for work clothes and boots. Others asked for bicycles to get to school or work. Through your generosity, you were able bring the joy of Christmas to these local families in need.



CHILDREN'S MINISTRY STARTS A NEW YEAR DISCOVERING THE EARLY MINISTRY OF JESUS!

C.I.A.—Christians in Action (Fifth Grade)

The C.I.A. kids will learn about the early life of Jesus as part of their faith journey. Lessons will focus on Jesus' baptism and temptation. They will be introduced to the disciples and the important role each had in spreading the Good News. The class will create a journal to help them uncover their role as today's disciples of Christ.
