We have approved your request dated October 31, 2017, to supplement your Biologics License Application (BLA) submitted under section 351(a) of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 262) for Influenza Vaccine (Afluria® and Afluria® Quadrivalent), manufactured at your Marburg, Germany; (b) (4) ; and Parkville, Australia facilities, to extend the indication for use to persons 6 through 59 months of age.

All promotional claims must be consistent with and not contrary to approved labeling. You should not make a comparative promotional claim or claim of superiority over other products unless you have substantial evidence or substantial clinical experience to support such claims (21 CFR 202.1(e)(6)).

Please submit an amendment to all pending supplemental applications for this BLA that include revised labeling incorporating a revised content of labeling that includes these changes.

FULFILLED POSTMARKETING REQUIREMENT

This submission fulfills your postmarketing requirement #2 identified in the August 26, 2016, approval letter for BLA STN 125254/565 for Influenza Vaccine (Afluria® Quadrivalent). The requirement addressed in this submission is as follows:

#2 Deferred pediatric study under PREA, to evaluate the immunogenicity and safety of Afluria Quadrivalent in the pediatric population 6 months through 4 years of age.

PEDIATRIC REQUIREMENTS

Under the Pediatric Research Equity Act (PREA) (21 U.S.C. 355c), all applications for new active ingredients, new indications, new dosage forms, new dosing regimens, or new routes of administration are required to contain an assessment of the safety and effectiveness of the product for the claimed indication in pediatric patients unless this requirement is waived, deferred, or inapplicable.

We note that you have fulfilled the pediatric study requirement for all relevant pediatric age groups for this application.
