


# ■ Description of Operations for Selecting Item/Icon/Button, etc.

Indicates to select "Edit" with 2 and commit with  $\textcircled{\bullet}$ .





## When Using the Product

Before you start using the product, be sure to read "Safety Precautions" in this manual to ensure correct use.

- Communication is not possible even inside the service area in places where the signal does not reach (e.g. tunnels and basements). Also, communication may not be possible in poor reception areas.
   Communication may be interrupted if you move into poor reception areas during communications.







## **Handling Precautions**

These precautions are provided to prevent product faults and to ensure that performance can be fully demonstrated. Thoroughly read these precautions to ensure correct use.

- Precautions common to the main unit, battery pack, back cover, charger, au IC card, peripheral devices
- Do not apply excessive force to the product during use. Be sure not to put the product into a tightly packed bag or place a heavy object on the product in a bag. Sitting on the product in your pocket might damage the display or internal circuit board resulting in a damage or malfunction.

Keeping an external device connected to the external connection terminal might damage the connector resulting in a malfunction. Such damage and malfunction are not covered by the warranty, even if there is no external damage.

 To ensure water/dust resistance (equivalent to IPX5, IPX8, and IP5X) of the product, use the product with the back cover tightly closed.

Note that the waterproof property is not guaranteed in every usage condition. Do not allow liquid or dust to get inside the product or allow liquid or dust get on the battery pack, charger, or optional accessories. Do not attach/remove the back cover of the product in the rain or with any water on its surface. Doing so may cause water intrusion resulting in internal corrosion.

Malfunctions determined to be caused by such water intrusion are not covered by the warranty.

- Do not use the product in extremely hot, cold or humid places.
   (Use within an ambient temperature range of 5°C to 35°C and humidity range of 35% to 85%.)

- Do not use the product in extremely hot, cold or humid places.

- Clean the connection terminal now and then with a dry cotton swab. Soiled terminals may result in a poor connection. Avoid using excessive force, which can bend the connection terminal.

- Clean the product with a soft dry cloth (such as the type used for eyeglasses). Forceful rubbing with a dry cloth may scratch the display. The display may be stained if splash or smear is left attached to the surface. Wiping the product using alcohol, thinner, benzene, detergent, etc. might erase the printing on the outer cover or cause malfunction.
- Use as far away as possible from fixed-line phones,
   TVs and radios. Use nearby might affect them.
- The product may become warm while charging or during other operations, depending on the situation, but this is not abnormal.
- Turn off the power of the product before removing the battery pack. If you remove the battery pack with the power on, saved data might be altered or lost.
- Do not place near corrosive chemicals or in places where corrosive gas is generated. Doing so may cause malfunction
- Do not use outside when you can hear thunder.
   Doing so might risk lightning strikes and electric shock.
- Be sure to use only the specified peripheral devices.
   Use of other peripheral devices might cause malfunction.
- Do not put the product in a cooking apparatus such as microwave oven or a pressure vessel. Doing so may cause malfunction.
- The customer is not allowed to disassemble, modify or repair the product. Doing so may cause malfunction. Modification of the product is in violation of the Radio Law and Telecommunications Business Law.

- To prevent short-circuiting of the connection terminal, do not allow your fingers or any other part of your body or conductive materials (metal, pencil lead, etc.) to come in contact with or enter these areas.
   Doing so may cause malfunction.
- In the event that the product gets wet while charging, immediately disconnect the power plug of the specified charger (sold separately).
- Do not use the product while driving a car or riding a motorbike or bicycle or while walking. Use of a mobile device while driving a car or motorbike is prohibited by law. Use of a cell phone while riding a bicycle may be punishable by some regulations.
- Using or charging the product in a bag or while it is covered with bedding may cause malfunction.
- When using a charger or external device, insert/ remove the connector straight to/from the jack. Improper connection may cause a fault.
- Do not expose the camera lens to direct sunlight for an extended period. Doing so may cause malfunction.
- Do not store the product in places subject to direct sunlight (e.g. in a car), places that get hot, places that get extremely cold, and in humid or dusty places. Doing so may cause malfunction.
- Do not leave the product on unstable or sloping surfaces. Be careful especially when the product is charging or set to vibrate. The product may fall and cause malfunction.
- For charging the product, do not exceed the rating of an outlet or wiring device by overloading an electrical circuit, etc.

 When the product gets warm while charging, some functions, screen brightness, etc. may be unavailable.

#### ■ Main unit

- Do not forcefully press, tap or intentionally subject the display to strong impact. Doing so may cause
  - scratching or damage.
- Do not forcefully press sharp objects or hard objects against keys or display surface. Doing so may cause scratching or damage.
- The product's keypad (touch area) can be operated with your fingers as a touchpad (Touch Cruiser EX). However, in the following cases, the touch area may not respond to touch operation. These may also result in malfunction.
  - · With gloves on
  - With fingernails
  - · With another object placed on the operation area
  - · With a sticker, etc. adhered
  - · With any water or condensation
  - · With wet or sweaty fingers
  - Under water

- Never use the modified product. Use of a modified device violates the Radio Law and Telecommunications Business Law. The product follows the regulations regarding the certification of conformity with technical regulations for specific radio stations etc. based on the Radio Law and authentication of conformity with technical regulations for devices etc. based on the Telecommunications Business Law, and the "Technical Conformity Mark

  "Can be displayed on the electronic nameplate of the product as a proof. To check the electronic nameplate:
  - From the standby screen, press  $\textcircled{o} \rightarrow [Settings] \rightarrow [Other settings] \rightarrow [Device info] \rightarrow [Authentication]$  If modifications are made to the internal components by removing the screws of the product, the certifications of conformity with technical regulations will become invalid. Never use the product without these certifications valid. Doing so violates the Radio Law and Telecommunications Business Law.
- Take care not to place magnetized items such as magnetic cards, speakers and TV sets near the product, as it might cause malfunction.
   Putting strong magnetism close to the product might cause false operation.
- Do not bring magnetized cards such as cash cards, credit cards and prepaid cards closer to the product.
   Doing so may result in loss of recorded information.

- When you put the product in your pocket or bag, take care so that the display does not come in contact with metal objects or other hard objects. Doing so may cause scratching or damage. Be aware that any metal or other hard cell phone strap that comes into contact with the display may scratch or damage them.
- When suddenly brought into a warm place from a cold place, or when in a humid location, or when used where temperature suddenly changes (e.g. near the air discharge port of an air conditioner), water drops (i.e. condensation) sometimes are formed inside the product. Note that when used under conditions such as this, humidity might cause corrosion or a fault.
- Do not exert excessive force when attaching/ removing a microSD memory card. Doing so may cause injury to your hand or finger.
- While writing/reading data to/from a microSD memory card, do not subject the product to vibration or impact, remove the battery pack, or turn off the power. Doing so may cause data loss or malfunction.
- Do not remove the black sheet on the inside of the back cover. Doing so may prevent Osaifu-Keitai<sup>®</sup> from reading/writing properly.
- Covering earpiece (receiver)/speaker section, mouthpiece (microphone), or air vent with stickers or fingers may hinder product performance.
- If the display gets damaged, immediately stop use and contact an au shop or Repair and Delivery Service Center, Keeping using it may cause injury.

- Putting a sticker, etc. on the main display or a key may cause malfunction or shortened usage time.
   Also, doing so may damage the product.
- Be careful not to pinch your fingers when opening/ closing the product.
- If you put magnetized objects, metal straps, etc. close to the product, the speaker section sometimes emits sounds. This is not a fault.
- Bright places such as under the direct sunlight sometimes make it hard to see the display. This is not a fault.
- Do not use with the back cover removed. Do not leave or store in that manner. Doing so may allow dust or other foreign matter to enter and cause a fault.
- Do not allow liquids, metal pieces, or other foreign matter into the au IC card slot or the microSD memory card slot on the product. Doing so may cause malfunction.
- Do not give strong impact on the product such as dropping, throwing, stomping. Doing so may cause malfunction.
- Do not put the product directly on sand at a beach, etc. If sand or other small particles might get inside the earpiece/speaker, or mouthpiece, it may cause the volume to drop or malfunction.

#### ■OEL display

- The product uses an OEL display in its sub-display. While OEL displays may experience lowered partial brightness if same images are displayed for a long time or if used for an extremely long time, this is due to the characteristics of the OEL display and is not a malfunction.
- OEL displays are manufactured with high-precision technology, and may experience very limited instances of pixels not lighting or being always on.
   Brightness may also appear unevenly in bands depending on the angle. This is due the structure of the OEL display, and is not a malfunction.
- Leaving an OEL display under direct sunlight might cause malfunction. Use caution when placing near a window or outdoors.

#### ■Battery pack



# (The battery pack of the product is a lithium-ion battery.)

The battery pack is not fully charged at the time of purchase. Charge the battery before using the product. Also charge the battery after long periods of disuse before using the product.

- Use in very hot or cold environments, for example, when left in an automobile with the windows closed in summer, will cause the battery capacity to drop and shorten the available battery usage time. This will also shorten the battery pack's service life. Try to use the battery pack as much as possible at room temperature.
- When the battery pack is not to be used for a long time, remove the battery pack from the product, and store it away from hot and humid places.
- The battery pack is a consumable item. If the performance of a battery pack does not recover (e.g. the usable time after each charge has become extremely short), the battery pack is at the end of service life, so stop use and buy a new one of the specified type. Note that the length of service life varies depending on the usage condition, etc.
- Battery packs sometimes swell up as they approach the end of their service life depending on the usage condition. This is due to the properties of lithium-ion batteries, and is not a problem in terms of safety.
- Do not use a battery pack that has been damaged or that is leaking battery fluid. Doing so may cause malfunction.
- Do not wet the battery pack with water, etc. A wet battery pack may cause malfunction. If you drop the product into water by mistake, immediately turn off the power, remove the battery pack, and contact an au shop or Repair and Delivery Support Center. Never charge a wet battery pack.

#### Charger

- Do not wrap power cords of the specified charger (sold separately) around the charger. Do not forcibly bend a plug of the charging equipment or the connection between the connector and power cord. Do not place heavy objects on the cord of the charger (sold separately), or do not pull the cord with excessive force. Doing so may cause malfunction.
- When unplugging the power plug of the specified charger (sold separately) from the outlet, hold the power plug to do so. If you pull the cord, it might be damaged.

#### ■au IC Card

- Do not forcibly remove or insert the au IC card. Be careful not to exert excessive force when inserting the card into your au cell phone.
- You are responsible for any damage caused by inserting your au IC card into some other IC card reader/writer, etc.
- Do not put stickers, etc. on the au IC card.
- Do not insert au IC card with a conversion adapter attached to. Doing so may cause malfunction.
- Do not damage the au IC card (use in a hot place, throw into fire, contact the metal part with foreign object, give an impact, bend, apply a load, moisten, etc.). Doing so may cause data loss or malfunction.

#### ■ Camera

 If the camera lens breaks, immediately discontinue using and contact an au shop or Repair and Delivery Service Center, Continued use may cause injury.

- When photographing important occasions, take a trial shot and check the shot image to make sure it is correctly shot.
- Do not shoot in areas where shooting is prohibited.

#### ■ Copyrights and rights of portrait

• If the data you shot or recorded using the product or the data you downloaded from the Internet, etc. is in part or in whole protected by the third party's copyright, you are not allowed to copy, distribute, publicly send, modify the data without consent of the copyright holder, except for personal use, under the copyright law.

In addition, do not use or modify portraits or names of other individuals without their consent, as it may infringe on rights of portrait.

Note that shooting and recording might be restricted at some live performances, shows and exhibitions even for personal use.

 Be careful about the copyright and portrait right when posting photos you shot, etc. on Internet homepages.

#### ■Back up content on the product

 Please back up important content recorded or downloaded to the product to an outside source.
 Content recorded to memory on the product sometimes disappears or is altered by unexpected factors, such as static electricity or a fault, or by repair, mishandling, etc.

# Notes on Waterproof/ Dustproof/Shockproof Properties

Before using the product, thoroughly read "Notes on Waterproof/Dustproof/Shockproof Properties" to ensure correct use. Failure to follow the contents described in these sections may cause the intrusion of water or sand, resulting in overheating, ignition, electric shock, injury or a fault.

Operation of the product in every possible condition during actual use is not guaranteed. Malfunctions determined to be caused by mishandling by the customer, for example, not following the contents described in "Notes on Waterproof/Dustproof/Shockproof Properties", are not covered by the warranty.

# Waterproof/Dustproof/Shockproof Properties of the Product

The product has the protection rating (JIS C 0920) for water resistance equivalent to IPX5<sup>1</sup> and IPX8<sup>2</sup> as well as dust resistance equivalent to IP5X<sup>3</sup> on the condition that the back cover is completely attached (by Company test methods).

And the product has shock resistance that meet the MIL-SPEC\*4 (based on in-house testing).

- \*1 IPX5 means that the cell phone continues to function as a phone after being subjected to a water jet (approximately 12.5 liters/min) discharged from a water pouring nozzle (inner diameter: 6.3 mm), from all directions and approximately 3 meters away from the cell phone for at least 3 minutes.
- \*2 IPX7 means that the cell phone continues to function as a phone after being gently lowered into a tank filled with still tap water (at room temperature) to the depth of 1.5 meter, immersed at the bottom for approximately 30 minutes and then taken out of the tank.
- \*3 IP5X means that the cell phone continues to function and safely maintain functioning as a phone after being placed in a test device containing 75 μm-particles and agitated for 8 hours and then removed. (Intrusion of particles is not completely blocked.)
- \*4 MIL standards compliance MIL-STD-810G Method 516.7 as per the US Department of Defense: According to standards complying with Shock-Procedure IV, the product is tested by being dropped from a height of 1.22 m in 26 directions onto plywood (lauan).
  - \* This does not guarantee resistance against all types of shock. As this assumes shock resistance during usage in everyday situations, care should be taken as breakage may occur if thrown, forcefully dropped, or otherwise subjected to excessive shock. Droppage may cause scratches even if functionality is not affected.

#### ■What the waterproof/dustproof properties allow you to do

- To use the product at the poolside. However, do not get it wet with water other than tap water such as water in the swimming pool or submerge it in water in the swimming pool.
- To wash the product with the low-pressure water flow of a tap water (6 liters/min or lower) at the room temperature (5° C to 35° C).

#### ■ Handling the product

- Close the back cover securely. The waterproof property is shown its ability by completely closing the cover. Even a fine obstacle (hair, sand, tiny fiber, etc.) put between contact surface may cause liquid or dust to get inside.
- If liquid such as water is splashed onto the product with the back cover opened, the liquid may seep inside and cause electric shock or malfunction. Discontinue using the product, turn off the power and then contact an au shop near you or Repair and Delivery Support Center
- When the product is wet, wipe it with a dry and clean cloth.
- When your hand or the product is wet, never open/ close the back cover.
- The product is resistant to fresh and tap water at room temperature (5° C to 35° C) only. If you let the product get wet with or submerged into the liquids other than fresh and tap water at room temperature, stop using it and wash it with fresh and tap water at room temperature.

 Do not use the external connection terminal when the jack is wet or sand or dust is attached to it. Doing so may cause impairment of the waterproof property or cause electric shock, short circuit, etc. resulting in a fire, burns, or a fault.

#### ■ Dustproof property of the product

- The dustproof property of the product only guarantees a protection rating equivalent to IP5X and does not guarantee its performance under other using conditions such as when the product is directly put on sand such as a beach.
- If dust is attached to the product, immediately wash it away with water or otherwise clear it completely before use.

## Notes on Using the Product

- Do not let the product submerged into or get wet with the liquids (seawater, water from a swimming pool, hot water of hot spring, water containing soap, detergent, bath powder, alcohol, soft drink, seasoning, etc.) other than tap water. Also, do not use it in a place where it gets wet with pet urine.
- If the product gets splashed, immediately rinse it off with tap water.
- If foreign object such as salt water, seawater, drink, seasoning, food, dirt or soil is attached on the product, immediately wash it away.
   When it gets dry and coagulated on the product, the stains get hard to get rid of and may cause scratching or fault.

- Using the product without completely washing sand or mud away may cause fault such as scratches and damages on the product.

- Do not expose the product to boiling water or hot air (from hairdryers, etc.). Also, do not use the product in saunas. The product is not designed to be heat resistant.
- The rapid changes of temperature may cause condensation, resulting in malfunction. Wait until the product reaches room temperature before you bring it from a cold place into a warm place.
   If condensation occurs, leave it in room temperature
- Do not use or leave the product in a humid place such as a bathroom or kitchen for an extended period of time
- · The product does not float on water.

- Volumes may temporarily become lower due to water entering in the earpiece, mouthpiece and speaker.
   Drain water and dry the product well before use.
- · The product does not float on water.
- · Do not use the product in heavy rain.
- Do not leave the product wet. Doing so may let the liquids freeze on the product in cold places or otherwise cause fault.

- Do not place the product directly on sand at a beach, sandbox, etc. or on mud. Grains of sand may get into the earpiece, speaker, etc., causing the volume to drop. If sand gets inside the product, it might cause overheating or a fault.
- If the back cover degrades or is damaged, the waterproof/dustproof property cannot be maintained.

# Maintaining the Waterproof and Dustproof Properties

#### Rubber seal

The rubber seal on the back cover is important in maintaining the waterproof/dustproof properties. Be sure to observe the following items.

- · Do not remove or scratch it.
- When closing the back cover, do not let the rubber seal caught. Also, do not insert sharp objects into gaps around the back cover or the external connection terminal
  - Doing so may damage the rubber seal and allow intrusion of liquid or dust.
- It is recommended to replace the parts for maintaining the waterproof/dustproof properties (pay service) once every two years regardless of whether any abnormality is present. For information on part replacement, contact an au shop near you.

## Precautions on Charging

The battery pack, desktop holder (sold separately), specified charger (sold separately), and optional

- accessories are not waterproof/dustproof. Be sure to check the following items before and after charging.
- Make sure that any water drop or foreign object is not on the product. If foreign object is attached on the product, immediately wash it away. #### **■** Emergency Call Location Notification

The product supports "Emergency call location notification" so that if you make an emergency call to Police, Fire and Ambulance or Regional Coast Guard Headquarters, your current location (GPS information) will be transmitted to the agency receiving the emergency call.

- In this section, Police (110), Fire and Ambulance (119) and Regional Coast Guard Headquarters (118) are collectively referred to as the emergency call receiving agency.
- This feature may not yet be available at some emergency call receiving agencies.
- If you add "184" before the Japan emergency call number 110/119/118, the emergency call responding agency will not be notified of your location and phone number.
- OVOLTE (LTE network) by au is used when connecting with emergency call receiving agencies within Japan. You cannot connect using 3G (circuit-switched network).
- In places where signal reception from GPS satellites or a base station is relatively poor, such as in an underground mall, inside a building or behind a tall building, the emergency call receiving agency may be notified of some other place different from your actual location.
- When GPS cannot be used to notify of your location, base station signal is used instead.

- When making an emergency call to Police, Fire and Ambulance or Regional Coast Guard Headquarters, always confirm where you are, and tell them your exact location on the phone. Note that depending on the area where you are calling, your call may not be connected to the agency having jurisdiction over that area.
- If the emergency call receiving agency determines that human lives and health are in danger, they will be able to acquire the caller's location information during the call or within a certain period of time after the call.
- When incoming reject is set and you make an emergency call, the incoming reject setting will be automatically disabled for 2 hours in order to receive calls from the emergency call receiving agency.







### Camera

## **Before Using the Camera**

- Fingerprints and smudges on the lens may cause images to appear unclear. Before capturing images, wipe the lens with a soft cloth.
   Rubbing forcefully may scratch the lens.
- Avoid fingers, hair, strap, etc. from covering the lens
- Avoid fingers, nair, strap, etc. from covering the lens during image capture. Hold the strap if it interferes with capture.
- When capturing images, avoid covering the microphone with fingers.
   Loudness of voices and surroundings during capturing may affect the sound quality of the microphone.
- When using the self-timer for image capture and the product is placed on an unstable surface, the product vibrates such as when you receive a call. It may cause the product to fall.
- Even in manner mode, the shutter clicks for photos.
   Also during movie shooting, start and stop beeps sound. The volume cannot be adjusted.
- Exposure of the lens for extended periods to direct sunlight or other sources of strong light may discolor the internal color filter and cause discoloration in still pictures/video.
- Capturing or saving still pictures/video after the product has been left in a warm place for an extended period may affect the still pictures/video.

- The camera comprises high-precision components, and includes pixels that are always on or that do not light. Image capture in extremely dark conditions will result in blue, red, and white dots, etc.
- Release the shutter after confirming that the subject is properly displayed in the main display. Moving the camera while releasing the shutter may cause still pictures to be blurry.
- When capturing images indoors under fluorescent lighting, faint stripes may be visible on the screen from fluorescent light flickering (very faint, invisible to the human eve), but is not a malfunction.
- The color of still pictures/video captured with the product camera may differ from the actual subject.
   Images may appear partially darker or brighter due to the characteristics of the lens and depending on the subject and illumination when capturing. Subjects may also appear partially distorted.
- Subjecting the product to shock while capturing images may cause the camera to lose focus. If focus is lost, activate the camera again.
- Focusing may not be possible for the following types of subjects.
  - · Low-contrast subjects such as plain walls
  - · Subjects with strong backlighting
- · Shiny subjects that reflect light brightly
- Subjects with a pattern that repeats horizontally such as blinds
- Several subjects with differing distances from the camera
- · Subjects in dark conditions





#### ■ Precautions When Using TV

- No communication charges or data communication charges are incurred for using TV. However, data communication charges are incurred for use of additional services associated with data broadcast that use data transmission. Regarding NHK reception fees, inquire with NHK.
- While displaying the TV screen, the product may become warm and cause low-temperature burns, etc. if used in contact with the skin for an extended period.
- Listening at a volume that is loud to the ears continuously for an extended period may affect hearing.
- TV is for digital terrestrial TV broadcast 1Seg in Japan only.

- Overseas, 1Seg cannot be used due to differing broadcast formats and frequencies. Also, BS and 110-degree CS digital broadcasts cannot be viewed.
