What makes your school eligible

Established one-to-one program

A one-to-one iPad or Mac schoolwide program for students and educators has been in place for more than two academic years at the school. All students and educators use Apple devices as their primary learning or teaching device.

Innovative use of the Apple platform

Students and educators deeply integrate Apple apps, educational apps from the App Store, books from Apple Books, and other digital resources into the curriculum to create new opportunities for learning.

Faculty proficiency with iPad or Mac

Leadership and educators are highly proficient in the use of Apple products. For K–12 schools, 75 percent of leadership and educators in the school must be recognized as an Apple Teacher. 
