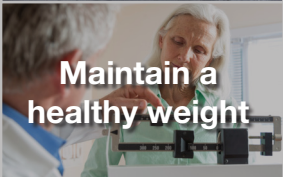
Monitor your blood pressure



Eat healthy meals



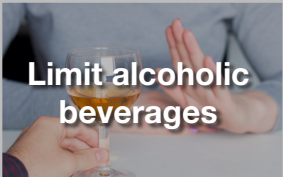
Be physically active



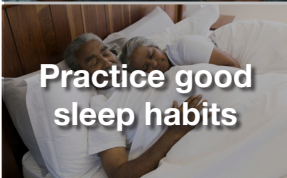
Maintain a healthy weight



Do not use tobacco products



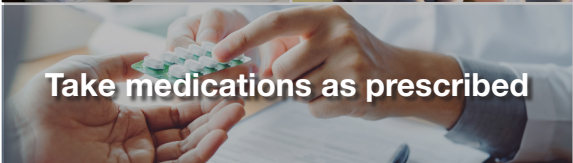
Limit alcoholic beverages
