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FOREWORD

New wave mental maths is a series of student workbooks, written to provide a comprehensive and structured daily mental maths program for students in Australian primary schools.

This new revised edition links to the Australian Curriculum Mathematics strands of Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry, and Statistics and Probability, and is designed to:

- encourage and develop students' mental calculation concepts and skills
- develop and reinforce students' problem-solving strategies through new, dedicated problem-solving questions
- develop and maintain students' speed of recall
- introduce students to, and help them practise and understand, a range of mathematics vocabulary.

Assessment activities are provided for students to assess, monitor and record their own performance on a weekly basis. A separate *teachers guide* is available, that accompanies the *New wave mental maths* series. This book contains guidelines to help develop mental strategies, suggestions for classroom use, assessment tools, a list of the concepts developed and answers.
