The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is pleased to provide you with the FDA Tribal Consultation Policy. The FDA Tribal Consultation Policy is intended to further the government-to-government relationship between FDA and American Indian and Alaska Native Tribes and to facilitate tribal consultation with FDA.

As you are aware, on February 29, 2016, we sent out a Draft FDA Tribal Consultation Policy and issued a notice in the Federal Register requesting comments, feedback and recommendations (FDA-2016-N-0586). FDA also provided information about the draft policy at the 2016 Annual HHS Tribal Budget and Policy Consultation and consulted with Indian Tribes during an All Tribes' Call in April 2016. The Agency reviewed and considered all comments on the draft policy and addressed this feedback in the FDA Tribal Consultation Policy, which is enclosed and also available on the FDA Tribal Affairs website [www.fda.gov/tribal](http://www.fda.gov/tribal).
