#### President's Letter — October 2020



As fires continue to burn in all of the western States, I would like to express my gratitude for those who are providing help to the affected. Thank you to our members who have been sheltering their neighbors, caring for animals, and donating guilts. We are fortunate to be a part of such a generous community.

I would like to share some thoughts about the fiscal health of our Guild. Our income has definitely been reduced due to the loss of the 2020 Quilt Show as well as reduced dues. However, our expenses are also reduced because we are not paying travel expenses to teachers and lecturers or rents for meeting space. This enabled the Board to adopt a balanced budget despite the current challenges.

While we are hopeful that we will be able to hold our 2021 Quilt Show, we did look at what impact losing it would have on our finances. Removing both the Show Expenses and Income from the budget would result in a loss of just 15 to 20% of our reserves. That means that we have enough money to continue to operate well into the future. Thank you to all of our members for continuing to support this organization.

You will find this newsletter filled with opportunities to create and connect with your fellow members; be sure to read it all so that you don't miss anything. If you know a member that doesn't use email or needs help using a computer, please reach out to help them so they can stay connected as well. As we continue to stay socially distant, we must rely on each other even more.

## **Call for Grant Requests**

MPQG annually awards grants to other community groups. Due to COViD, these groups are starting out the year with many restrictions, but we hope that as things return to normal quilting will still be a part of their plan. The grants are small (between \$150 and \$200). They are awarded to groups which focus on providing educational and creative programs that preserve the heritage of quiltmakers, promote excellance in quilt design and craftmanship, and raise public awareness regarding the art of quilting. Grant requests are accepted between October 1st and December 31st of each year.

## **Upcoming Workshop**

# "Artful Improv — Permission to Play" Workshop with Cindy Grisdela via ZOOM

#### 2-part Workshop:

Saturday, October 10 — 9 am-12 noon Sunday, October 11 — 11 am - 2 pm



Learn to create your own original quilts with no pattern using improvisational piecing techniques. Students will learn to let go of the "rules" and piece blocks in an intuitive, free form fashion. We will explore contemporary improv blocks, improv circles, and angled stripes, plus insets and curved strips. Use strips and scraps to add interest and make your design your own. There's no measuring or precise cutting and each quilt will be unique.



We will discuss color choices and using simple design principles to create an original dynamic composition. The extended class goes into these ideas in more depth, as well as discussing quilting options and alternative finishing techniques.

Basic sewing skills and a machine in good working order are necessary. Best for intermediate to advanced quilters ready to take the next step to creating original designs. The quilt shown is an example of a quilt I made using the techniques taught in this class.

- No schlepping. I have access to all my fabric during a workshop and am using my own machine.




- Sharing is nurturing whether in a workshop or at the "mingle" and I am learning about members that I wouldn't sit next to during a live meeting.

# Block of the Month — October \* Sunshine Star \*

George Harrison wrote *Here Comes the Sun* in 1969 at the house of his friend Eric Clapton, in response to the dark mood surrounding the Beatles. He was under quite a great deal of personal stress during this time with a surgery to remove his tonsils, an arrest for possession of drugs, and learning that his mother had terminal cancer. That winter was the worst recorded in England and the demands of Apple records were making recording feel "like school". He wrote, "The relief of not having to go see all those dopey accountants was wonderful, and I walked around the garden with one of Eric's acoustic guitars and wrote *Here Comes the Sun*."

#### Remember the instructions:

- Choose a favorite color palette of fabrics in a variety of values to use on all the blocks that you create. Use your scraps!
- Each month we will post a new Beatles song with prompts and inspirations for your block. You
  will be given the option of following the instructions for a block that we choose or
  creating your own design inspired by the song.
- All squares will be either 18 ½ inches or 12 ½ inches unfinished; your choice. If you feel like you might not complete all the months you might prefer the larger size.
- We will ask that you share your completed block each month on our Zoom Show and Tell and then keep your blocks to put together in a quilt of your own design.

The directions are for a 12" finished or 12 ½" unfinished block.

If you make an 18" finished or 18 1/2" unfinished block, your square sizes are

A- 5"

B- 5 1/2"

Trim your HSTs to 5 "
