



Message From The G.M.

As we move into the summer at Heritage Pines the residents will see the renovation of our clubhouse begin. We will enlarge the Restaurant and Bar, and in September we will renovate the pool and the outside decks. New furniture, carpets and wall coverings will be installed. A "Tommy Bahama" resort style has been selected for the interior and exterior renovation. We will carry this theme forward with the renovation of the pool and outside decks. Color boards and renderings will be in the lobby to illustrate the improvements. The exterior will be started in January 2011 with new windows, doors, roof, siding and a covered roof in the back where the trellis will be replaced. This is being paid for mostly from our Reserve, with the expansion being paid for with our money we have saved in the 2010 operating budget.

Our amenity analysis consultant will be interviewing focus groups on July 23rd, 2010. These groups will be comprised of 10 residents each. 



Messages From The Management

Notes From The Architectural Review Committee

If by chance you don't have a copy of the Heritage Pines Architectural Review Policy Manual, pick up a copy at the front desk. The manual will help guide you in making decisions about changes to the exterior of your home and plantings in your yard.

When submitting an Architectural Change Request form, please give as much information as possible. Such as measurements, color, materials to be used, and samples if applicable. Most of the time when a request is rejected, it's because we don't have enough information.

When putting in a new planting or replacing a plant, the committee needs to know that the new plants are Florida Friendly. Please remember that a planting must be five (5) feet inside your property line.

Now about the nameplate that is on the lamppost. It is <u>very</u> important that there is a nameplate on each and every house in the development. Not only does it help friends and neighbors find your house, but also helps emergency people locate it. If you rent your property, it is recommended that the house number be on the nameplate. If you are a new resident and there isn't a name plate on the lamppost, contact the front desk and these kind ladies will give you the information you need to get your name plate.

How to Dispose of Medications

Expired or unwanted prescriptions or over the counter medications should never be thrown down the sink or toilet. They will cause contamination to Florida's aquatic system. Please follow the simple steps the County has set up for this matter.

- 1. Keep all medications in original containers but take off your name and prescription information. Either black it out or remove it.
- 2. For pills add some water or soda to start them to dissolve, for liquids add some other inedible item like cat litter, or dirt or cayenne pepper.
- 3. Close the lid and secure with duct or packing tape.
- 4. Place the bottle inside a non see thru container like coffee can, juice container and tape it closed.
- 5. Hide this container in the trash. Do not recycle.

With these steps you will protect animals and humans from the wrong interaction with the medications. Please don't flush or wash away in the sink.

Worry no more Heritage Pines! As a service to our residents, we are now offering a propane exchange within our community starting July 1st, 2010. Hours of service will be Mon-Th, 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m., Fri-Sun 10:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., holiday hours will be posted in advance. The process is simple:

- 1. Come up to the clubhouse front desk or bar or proshop. (Please do not bring the tank into the clubhouse.)
- 2. Ask to exchange your propane. The cost is \$19.99 plus tax to exchange or \$51.99 to purchase a new tank (no exchange).

3. Our staff will contact a member of maintenance, who will meet you down by the recycling center located next to the cart barn.

4. Exchange your empty tank, for a full one!





EAR-TIPPING FOR FERALS

If you have ever come across a stray cat with what looks like one ear tip cut off, then you have found a feral cat that has been humanely trapped, neutered, given a rabies shot, ear-tipped by the vet and then returned to his/her habitat. Likely, a devoted volunteer is feeding the cat each day to keep it healthy.

According to the experts on feral cat behavior and management, this is the best and most effective way to care for older or unadoptable feral cats. As explained in previous articles, feral cats are neither domestic pets, nor wildlife. They are the recent descendants of un-neutered pets that were abandoned by an irresponsible human. Snowbirds, do not EVER turn your cat outside when you fly north for the summer. Contact the Kitty Coalition and we will do our best to help you find a suitable home. Abandonment is both cruel and illegal, and it burdens your neighbors.

Some humane groups "tip", or "notch" the right ear for males and left ear for females. However, the vast majority simply tip the left ear for both genders. That is the method Spay Pasco uses, and therefore our cats in HP will have the left ear tipped regardless of gender. If you find a stray and both ears are in tact, please call us to arrange trapping. We will attempt to learn where the cat eats and spends most of its time, and then enlist the help of a resident to monitor the trap. Once the cat is trapped, we will take it from there.

On May 10, we trapped our first beautiful feral, a sweet boy we named "Chief", although he rightfully earned the nickname "Houdini", as he very quickly escaped from his foster home and is now on the lam again. However, he had already been neutered, given shots and his ear tipped, so he is our first success story. The vet pronounced him a true feral, as he "tried to climb the walls of the clinic" rather than be handled by a human. He has a wide range of territory, so you might see him anywhere. Reportedly, he's

been seen in Linkside, Hilltop, Regal Pines and Winding Way. Once you've seen him, you'll never forget him, as he is absolutely beautiful. He likes to flirt with the pet cats who live indoors.

On May 18, Will Jackson trapped "Freedom", an estimated three year old male, near the Cart Barn. Will turned him over to Kitty Co. volunteers and we took him to the vet as well. He was even more feral than Chief, and no one has reported seeing him since his release. Freedom is a gray tabby with a noticeably broad nose. If you see Freedom, with his left tipped ear, let us know! We have a feeder for the cart barn, but she hasn't seen Freedom even once. Instead, she is working to win the trust of an orange tabby she calls Ginger.

Every two weeks, the Heritage Pines Kitty Coalition sends out a bulletin by e-mail, with updates, photos and information on our stray and feral kitties.
