Lessons from SHREK – Part 2

In the previous newsletter, we looked at one lesson to take away from the story of Shrek. Today, now that the show is over – and what a tremendous show it was: well done to the entire performance crew and support team! – I want us to think about another valuable message from the story.

Well, I've already hinted at it: it took a whole community to make the Musical happen.

Shrek, both at the beginning and even towards the end of the tale, is intent on isolating himself from everyone and everything, to the point of building a wall all around his swamp.

Donkey asks a simple question: "Who are you trying to keep out?"

And, later, Donkey makes the point that "friends forgive each other", which is the turning point for Shrek to find a way to restore relationships.

None of us can live without community – nor, I believe, were we intended to.

- We hear of Adam given a soulmate
- We read about the joys of friendship
- We discover that the Church is likened to a body, or a family, where everyone belongs and has a role to play

It's no wonder because God is a relational, a personal God who seeks to be in relationship with you and me.

To make sure this message is understood, and God's unconditional love is known, Jesus lived and died: to welcome, to forgive and to heal relationships we have with ourself, with others and especially with God.

One of the things that we can be assured of in life is that other people are sometimes (okay, often) going to bother us. Some of them will say things we don't agree with. Some of them will do things we don't like. Some of them will take things we want. Sometimes they will hurt us with their words and sometimes they might even bump into us, trip us up or throw food in our direction. To be fair, the last of these is more likely when we are seven than when we are 47, but it is still in the realms of possibility in this big ole' world crammed with humans. Sometimes people will be mean (and mean it) and sometimes they will seem mean (and mean something entirely different). Our kids (and ourselves) are going to have to jostle alongside others of all shapes, sizes and smells for their whole duration on this earth. We can get het up about these things (and sometimes we must) or we can develop ways of thinking which allow us to 'jostle with joy', or at least with equanimity (think this doesn't apply to you? Ask yourself how you react when someone jumps a queue). Psychologist Kirralie Smout suggests three ways we can teach our kids to think that might help them survive the jostle:

1. 'Accidents happen' thinking – sometimes we get hurt or we miss out but nobody meant it to happen
2. 'Everyone has challenges' thinking – sometimes people are mean but maybe there's a reason. Everyone has a story.
3. 'Not terrible and possibly even good' thinking – not everything that we don't like turns out to be bad for us.

It can be easy to assume that someone (or, yep, the whole darn universe) is out to get us. These thinking styles are about changing our default response when things go against us. So next time someone cuts you off in traffic see if you can think of three good reasons why they may have done so (no expletives allowed!).

Grooming

Sunshine Coast Regional Track and Field Trials

At the Sunshine Coast Regional Track and Field Trials, Luke Rychvasky (5L) eclipsed all previous records and was awarded Independent Athlete of the carnival. Luke dominated all events and is now on his way to the Queensland State Track and Field Trials.

Luke took 1st place in the 200m, 100m, shot put, long jump and tetraathlon (like the Olympic decathlon, but for Primary aged students) in the 10 years boy's division. He also placed 3rd in the 800m.

Luke is an outstanding prospect in track and field and is to be congratulated for his determination and dedication to the sport. His all-round track and field skills are very rare, given most athletes focus on just one or two events in the specific areas of sprinting, jumping and throwing. For Luke to be able to excel across such a broad range of track and field events is indeed unique and places him in an elite realm amongst his primary athletic peers.
