FOR YOUR SAFETY

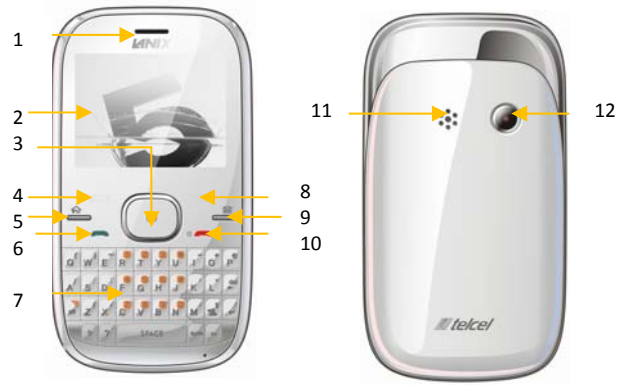
Your phone is a QUERTY device, and it is a phone that encloses features, such as **Camera, Video Player, Audio Player, FM radio** etc.

Position of the Keys

1. Receiver	2. Display screen
3. Key to Web	4. Menu key
5. Main menu key	6. Call key

Function of Keys

Key	Description
Call (SIM card) Key	To make/answer a call from SIM card. In the standby mode, press this key to access the Call log.
End/Power Key	End an ongoing call. Press and hold this key to turn on or off the mobile phone.
Navigation Keys	In the editing mode, use the keys to move the cursor. In the standby mode, press the keys to access the function assigned to these keys.
Center(OK) key	In standby mode, press this key to access Web.
Right Soft Key	Use the right soft key to execute the functions indicated at the right of the prompt bar on the screen. In the menu mode, press this key to quit the current menu and return back to the standby mode.
Keypad/Numeric Keys	Used to enter numbers, letters and some special characters.

GETTING STARTED

Please switch off your phone before inserting or removing the battery/SIM card or memory card.

Installing SIM Card and Battery

- Hold the phone with the front facing downwards; pull the battery cover
- Remove the back cover of the phone
- Insert the SIM card in the slot.
- Attach the battery.
- Push the battery cover until it clicks into place.

Installing Memory Card

- Switch off your phone.
- Remove the battery cover.
- Slide the MicroSD card into the slot.
- Attach the battery.
- Push the battery cover until it clicks into place.

Switch On/Off the Phone

To turn on/off the phone, press and hold the **End/Power key**.


Automatic Customer Registration

After 4 hours of usage a SMS from the phone will be sent automatically for the customer registration.

Note: standard SMS charges apply.

BASIC OPERATIONS

To Make Calls

The icons  on the screen, signifies that you have full signal strength and hence you can easily make or receive calls.

In order to make a call:

- Input the phone number (should affix the international/national/regional code or district code if necessary) and then press dial key.
- Press **Call Key** to dial a phone number listed in the recent call log in the standby mode.
- Press and hold numeric keys **(2)-(9)** to dial the speed dial number assigned to the numeric keys.
- You can select a contact number from the phonebook and call the contact person.

Tip: The signal strength may influence the quality of connection.

Answer/Reject an Incoming Call

- Press **Call Key** to receive the incoming call.
- Press **End Key** to reject an incoming call.

Options During a Call

Press **<Options>** to **Hold Single Call, End Single Call, New Call, access Phonebook, access Call History, access Messages, Sound recorder, Mute the call, open or close the DTMF function** during the call.

MAIN MENU

Press the **Left Soft Key** in the idle mode to access the main menu. Press the Navigation Keys Up/Down/Left/Right to choose the desired operation and press Ok to enter the selected operation.



Your phone features, sending and receiving of SMS (Short Message Service) or MMS (Multimedia Message Service). A SMS is a text message that can only contain letters, numbers and symbols. A MMS is a multimedia message that can contain not only the letters, numbers and symbols but also videos, pictures, etc. To create a message, select **Write Message** option. Inbox sub-menu enables you to view all the messages received. All the messages that are sent successfully from SIM card get stored in the Sent Messages folder. Tap main menu > Messages , do as follows:

- Write Message: You can write MMS/SMS and then send out through SIM card
- Inbox: You can see the MMS/SMS in the inbox.
- Drafts: you can store the unsent and prominent messages here.
- Outbox: While failing to send SMS/MMS, the messages will be saved here by default.
- Sent messages: The message have been sent out, which will be saved here.
- Delete messages: Refer to the phone to delete the message of Inbox, Drafts, Outbox, Sent message and All messages.
- Broadcast messages: Cell broadcast is a kind of information service such as weather report, traffic etc that the network operator sends to the GSM users within certain area.
- Templates: you can pre-edit some common phrases, which is convenient for quick SMS editing.
- Message settings: you can set or view information of text/multimedia/service message here.



CALL CENTER

This sub-menu lets you view the call details i.e. the missed, received and dialled call logs. Scroll the Up/Down keys to select a call and then select view to see the details. Press options to perform the operations, such as call, send message, delete etc.

Missed calls: you can check and view the missed calls.

Dialed calls: you can check and view the dialed calls.

Received calls: you can check and view the received calls.

Delete call logs: you can delete the Dialed calls, Missed calls, Received calls or All calls.

Note: The actual call duration and service time in the bill of the service provider may be different from them, which depends on the network functions, accounting rounding and tax etc.

Call timers

This needs the support of the network service provider.

- Last Call: With this function, you can view the duration of the last call.
- Dialed calls: With this function, you can view the duration of all calls.
- Received calls: With this function, you can view the duration of the received calls.
- Reset all: With this function, you can reset all the records of the calls.

Text msg. Counter

With this function, you can see and preset the number of sent messages and received messages.

GPRS Counter

- Last Sent: You can view the sending traffic of last link.
- Last Received: You can view the reception traffic of last link.
- All Sent: You can view the sending traffic of all links.
- All Received: You can view the reception traffic of all links.

Reset Counter: You can clear all link traffic.

Call Settings

- **Call Waiting:** Activate, the network will notify you of a new incoming call while you have a call in progress (Network Service).
- **Call Divert:** This network service allows you to divert your incoming calls to another number. For details, contact your service provider.
- **Call barring:** > Activate, this network service allows you to restrict incoming calls from your phone. For details, contact your service provider.
- **Line switching:** Line 1 or Line 2.

Furthermore, you can set Call time reminder, Auto redial and Answer mode.



IDEAS

Ideas gives you various marvelous enjoyment such as Portal Movil, Mi Telcel, iPromociones, MSNGR, Plugger, iDeportes and iVideos. Enter the entertainment interface, you should ensure you have GPRS/WAP. Please contact the local networking provider for more details.



TELCEL

STK service is the tool kit of SIM card. This phone supports the service function. The specific items are depended by SIM card and network.



PHONEBOOK

Press **Left Soft Key** in the standby mode and then select **Phonebook**. The device can store 300 numbers.

Add New Contact

- **Go to main Menu and select phonebook**
 - **Select Add new phonebook**
 - **Select the storage (SIM card or Phone)**
 - **Add the required details i.e number and contact name**

MEDIA

This menu is specifically designed for the entertainment purpose of the user. To enter this menu, go to the main menu and select Multimedia. The various multimedia features provided by your device includes Image viewer, Video recorder, Video player, Sound recorder and FM radio.

Image viewer

Pictures taken can be accessed quickly through Image Viewer. Go to **Menu > Media > image viewer**. All the images available in the storage selected by you are displayed.

Video Recorder

In standby mode, select **Menu > Media > Video Recorder** to launch the video recorder and shoot your videos. Click the center key to start recording.

Video Player

Select a video clip and press OK key to open it. Press OK key to play the video clip.

Sound Recorder

The mobile phone supports 2 recording formats: WAV and AMR. You can record conversations, which may be saved to the Audio folder under File Manager.

FM Radio

You can use your phone to listen to FM radio stations.



CAMERA

The phone is provided with a Camera, which supports the photographing functions. Pictures are saved in the file system of the phone or MicroSD card.



WEB

This menu gives you a good experience of surfing internet. You can enjoy it after you have GPRS/WAP.



AUDIO PLAYER

Audio Player allows you to play audio files. Please save your audio files in the My Music folder of the MicroSD card. To enjoy music by tapping to enter this menu.



TV

Your mobile phone is provided you for television. You can watch TV by searching the channels. While watching TV, you can dial or receive a call normally. During call conversation, the TV will turn mute automatically.



GAMES

The device offers you an embodied game, Puzzle. If you want to know how to play game, please refer to "Help".



CONFIGURATION

User profiles

The phone provides seven pre-defined user profiles that allow the operations of the phone to best suit the environment you are in. The profiles are **General, Silent, Meeting, Outdoor, My style, Headset and Bluetooth**. The phone will automatically enter the headset profile if you connect the headset to your phone.

- **Alert Type:**
 - Ring Only: Just ringing, no vibration.
 - Vib. Only: Just Vibrating, no ringing.
 - Vib. and Ring: Ringing and vibration.
 - Vib.then Ring: Ring after vibration.
- **Ring Type:**
 - Beep once: Beep once when there's an incoming call.
 - Repeat: Rings continuously when there's an incoming call.
 - Ascending: Rings continuously and the volume increases gradually.

Furthermore, you can set the Incoming Call, Ringtone volume, Message, Message volume, Keypad, Keypad volume, Power on/off and system alert as per your choice.

Phone Settings

- Date and time: With this function, you can set the date and time here.
- Schedule power on/off: To set the time, schedule power on/off.
- Language: Your device supports English and Spanish.
- Pref. Input method: you can set abc, es and Numeric as your prior language.
- Display: With this function you can configure the basic status of display characteristics including Wallpaper, Screen Saver and Show date and time.
- Greeting text: On/Off. If On, when you switch on the device next time, the screen will display the greeting text.
- Dedicated key: you can define the Up/Down/ Left/Right soft key as the desired functions.
- Auto update of time: To set the mobile phone to automatically update time according to the current time zone, choose "On".
- Flight mode: Access the menu, you can choose from Normal mode, Flight mode and Query when power on. If Flight mode is set to On, you may cannot receive calls/messages.
- Misc. Settings: You can adjust the brightness and duration of LCD backlight.

Network settings

Network Selection: You can search the network again. Select your favorite network and choose to register the network automatically or manually.

Preferences: You can set the preferred registered network for SIM card.

Security settings

SIM Security

- **PIN Lock:** You can set SIM lock (PIN code) as on/off. When this option is chosen, it is necessary to input PIN code for every insert of the SIM card.
- **Change PIN:** you should contact with the SIM networking operator to get the PIN code firstly and then you can change the SIM password.

Phone security

Phone lock: To activate it, you should input phone password 1122. While you power on the device next time, you may be asked for input the password.

Change password: The old password is 1122, you can change the password here.

Auto keypad lock: The mobile phone has screen lock function. When it lasts certain time, the screen will be locked, including such options as Off, 5s, 30s, 1min and 5min.

Connectivity

Data account

GPRS—You can set the name, APN, user name, password, Auth. type, DNS.

Note: For related charging standard and detailed settings, please consult the local network service operator. Different network service providers provide different services. Consult the local network operator.

Restore Factory Settings

Access **Settings** to select **Restore Factory Settings**, and press OK. All settings can be restored to factory settings with this function. The default password is **1122**.



FILE MANAGER

You can browse, open and manage the data saved in the Phone and micro SD card by accessing the File Manager sub-menu. The phone provides a certain space for users to manage files and supports the micro SD card.



TOOLS

The organizer menu gives you access to a number of additional features including Alarm, Tasks, Calendar, World clock, Calculator, Unit converter and Currency converter.

Calendar

Access this submenu, you can view the calendar.

Tasks

You can create new memo by editing necessary information, i.e. time, date, subject, alarm, repeat etc.

Alarm

Your device gives you 5 clocks to wake you up or remind you of prominent appointment.

World Clock

Press the left and right direction keys to view the current time of every country corresponding to every time zone.

Calculator

You can make some simple calculation.

Unit converter

Choose the function as the phone guide to convert the unit.

Currency Converter

To save exchange rate, press "OK", then choose to set exchange rate. Choose one exchange rate from the displayed options. After that, press "OK" to confirm. Then the exchange rate will be saved in the memory until you enter a new one to replace it. To convert currency, enter the sum to be converted, press "OK" and then choose to local currency or foreign currency.



BLUETOOTH

You can use the BT to transfer data and files by pairing with other device.

Use of USB

Notices before use

- Always connect and stop USB device correctly.
- Never use Windows formatting command to format the mobile disk of the mobile phone; otherwise, it will be damaged severely.
- USB work environment:
 - Windows2000 / XP.
 - For other operation systems, the connection between PC and the mobile phone cannot be conducted unless USB driver is installed.

Battery Information and Care

- Please dispose of your battery properly.
- Do not disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- Keep the battery's metal contacts clean.
- Recharge the battery after long periods of non-use to maximize battery life.
- Battery life will vary due to usage patterns and environmental conditions.
- The self-protection function of the battery cuts the power of the phone when its operation is in an abnormal status. In this case, remove the battery from the phone, reinsert it, and turn the phone on.

General Notice

- Using a damaged battery or placing a battery in your mouth may cause serious injury.
- Do not place items containing magnetic components such as a

credit card, phone card, bank book, or subway ticket near your phone. The magnetism of the phone may damage the data stored in the magnetic strip.

- Talking on your phone for long period of time may reduce call quality due to heat generated during use.

Troubleshooting

Phenomena	Possible Causes
Unable to switch on	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Does the battery have power?2. Is the battery placed correctly
SIM failed	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The SIM card is dirty. Clean it.2. Reinstall the SIM card.3. The SIM card is damaged. Replace it.
Poor signals	Check the signal strength icon on the screen. If the icon contains 4 bars, it

	indicates the signal is the strongest; if below 1 bars, it indicates the signal is very poor.
Unable to dial out	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Maybe you have set Hide My Caller ID but your network operator does not provide this service for you. 2. Strong interference exists around you. 3. Maybe you have activated the call restriction function. 4. Maybe you have activated Line 2 but your network operator does not provide this service for you.
Unable to charge the battery	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The battery may discharge too much; so it cannot be charged until it is connected for certain time. 2. Its performance has worsened.
Unable to register to the network	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Too weak signals or strong interference. 2. SIM card installed properly? Bad contact or SIM card damaged? If the SIM card is broken, please contact the network operator to replace it.
Unable to access service menus.	Maybe the SIM card does not support service function.
Only part of the photo set as standby photo	The size of the photo may be too big. The recommended size is 220*176
