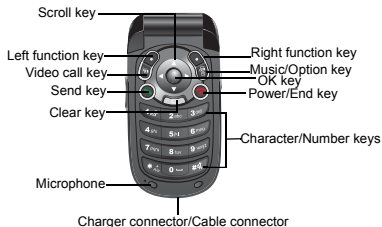

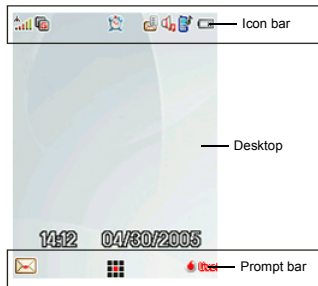

### ◆ Desktop

This area displays the operations and the function options.

### ◆ Prompt Bar

This area displays the available operations at present.

The content displayed here varies with different screens.

- 1 Press  to execute the operation indicated on the left of the prompt bar.
- 2 Press  to execute the operation indicated on the right of the prompt bar.
- 3 Press  to start the selected function or option in the menu.

## 2 Getting Started

### Loading the Battery

To load the battery:

- 1 Fit the battery into the battery slot on back of the phone.
- 2 Press the battery down until it clicks into place.



### Unloading the Battery

Only unload the battery after powering off your phone. Otherwise, your phone may be damaged.  
To unload the battery:

- 1 Push the battery latch upward.
- 2 Take out the battery.



### Charging the Battery

Before charging the battery, please read carefully the following precautions.

- Note**
- When you charge the battery for the first time, please charge it for at least 12 hours.
  - The battery discharges even while not being used. So if you haven't used it for a long time, please recharge it first.



## ■ Charging the Battery

- The charging time depends on the environmental temperature and the age of the battery.
- The battery can be recharged repeatedly, but it will eventually wear out. After normal charging, if the time that the battery powers your phone becomes much shorter than usual, please replace the battery with one of the same type.
- Do not strike, toss or cause any kind of violent shock to the battery, otherwise liquid leakage, body damage, overheating, explosion or fire may occur.
- Charge the battery by using the charger supplied with your phone.

You can charge the battery at any time and use your phone during charging.

- When you charge the battery with your phone powered on, the battery level icon will appear on the upper right corner of the internal screen. During battery charging, the charging indicator will blink continuously. When the charging indicator stops blinking, it indicates that the charging is finished.

- During charging with your phone powered off, a charging indicator indicating the power level of the battery will appear on the screen and blink continuously. When it stops blinking, it indicates that the charging is finished.

### Note

When the battery power level is very low, the phone makes alert sounds and displays a prompt. When the battery power level is too low, the phone will power off automatically.

## Charging with a Cable Charger

---

Before charging the battery with a cable charger, please make sure that the battery has been properly loaded into your phone.

To charge the battery:

- 1 As shown in the following figure: Insert the plug of the charger into the connector of the phone. Before inserting, please make sure that the arrow on the charger output jack points to the front side of the phone.

- 2 Plug in the connector of the charger to a power socket.



## Loading the SIM Card

Your SIM card contains such information as phone numbers and contacts. Load your SIM card before using your phone. To use the SIM card properly, please read the following instructions carefully.

### Note

- Keep the SIM card out of the reach of children.
- The SIM card and its metal contacts are easily damaged by scratching or bending. So be careful when you carry, load or remove it.

- Always disconnect the charger from the phone before loading or removing the SIM card.

## Loading the SIM Card

To load the SIM card:

- 1 Switch off the phone and remove the battery.
- 2 Position the card at the card slot entrance, making sure it is facing the same way as shown in the diagram below, with the notched corner at the bottom right. Then slide in as shown.



## ■ Loading/Removing a Memory Card

### Removing the SIM Card

---

To remove the SIM card, power off your phone and take out the battery. Then press the SIM card with one finger and slide it out of the slot.



- 2 After inserting the memory card completely, replace the rubber cap.



- 3 To remove a memory card, open the rubber cap and press the memory card gently. Now the memory card will pop up automatically. Then take it out as shown in the following figure.

### Loading/Removing a Memory Card

The Vodafone 710 phone supports a memory card (mini-SD) with a capacity up to 1 GB.

- 1 Remove the rubber cap from the memory card slot; then insert the memory card into the slot, as shown in the following figure.



## Powering On/Off

### Powering On

Ensure that the SIM card is in your phone and that the battery has been charged.

Press and hold  until power is on.

### Switching Off

Press and hold  until power is off.

### Access Codes

If you have set the phone password and the PIN is **ON**, you have to enter the corresponding access

codes when you power on your phone. For setting and changing the access codes, please refer to "Settings/Security Setup" on page 94.

#### ◆ Phone Password

The phone password is used to protect your phone from unauthorized use. The phone password is preset as 0000 for your Vodafone 710 phone.

#### ◆ PIN

The PIN (Personal Identification Number) code is used to protect your SIM card from unauthorized use. Usually you will be supplied with the PIN code when you get the SIM card from Vodafone. If you have not got one or you have lost it, please consult Vodafone.

#### ◆ PIN2

Some SIM cards provide PIN2 code. Some special functions such as the "Fixed Dialer Number" are not available until you enter the PIN2 code and, at the same time, your SIM card must support these functions.

#### ◆ PUK

To unlock the locked SIM card, you have to enter the PUK (PIN Unblocking Key) code. Usually you will be

## ■ Powering On/Off

supplied with the PUK code when you get the SIM card from Vodafone. If you have not got one or you have lost it, please consult Vodafone.

### ◆ PUK2

Some SIM cards provide PUK2 code which is used to unlock the locked PIN2 code. Usually you will be supplied with the PUK2 code when you get the card from Vodafone. If you have not got one or you have lost it, please consult Vodafone.



# 3 Call Service



## Making or Answering Calls

### Making a Video Call

---




You can make a video call with someone whose phone also supports video calls.

- 1 Enter or edit a phone number in any of the following ways:
  - Enter a phone number through the keypad.
  - Select a number from the **Call Log** screen.
  - Access the **Contacts** screen to select a phone number from **Phone** or **SIM**.
- 2 press  or select **Options > Call > Video Call** to dial.
- 3 Press  to end the video call.

**Note** To delete a wrong number, press  once to delete the digit to the left of the cursor; press and hold  to delete all.

### Making a Voice Call

---

- 1 Enter or edit a phone number in any of the following ways:
  - Enter a phone number through the keypad.
  - Press  to select a number from the **Call Log** screen.
  - Access the **Contacts** screen to select a phone number from **Phone** or **SIM**.
- 2 Press  to dial.
- 3 Press  to end the call.

### Making Voice Calls Using SDN

---

You can make a voice call through speed dialing. For instructions on assigning speed dialing numbers, refer to "Contacts/Speed Dialing Numbers" on page 27.

To make a call by speed dialing number(SDN), press and hold the number key until the phone dials the corresponding phone number.

## ■ Making or Answering Calls

### Answering or Rejecting Calls




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If there is an incoming call, the phone rings or vibrates, and displays the phone number or the caller name (if the caller is saved as a contact, except the calling ID is hidden).


#### ◆ When Auto Answer Disabled

You can set the answer mode to **Open flip**, **Any key** or **Send key**. For details, refer to "Settings/Call Setup/Answer Mode".

The following describes how to answer or reject a call in different answer modes:

To...	Operation
Answer a call	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• If the answer mode is <b>Open flip</b>, open the phone.</li><li>• If the answer mode is <b>Any key</b>, open the phone and press any key, except  and .</li><li>• If the answer mode is <b>Send key</b>, press .</li><li>• If the headset is in use, press the control key on the headset.</li></ul>

---

To...	Operation
Reject a call	Press or select <b>Options &gt; Reject</b> .
End a call	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• If the headset is not in use, you can close the phone or press .</li><li>• If the headset is in use, press the control key of the headset.</li></ul>
Reply by message	Select <b>Options &gt; Reply</b> to send a pre-defined message to the caller.

---


#### Note

When the phone is closed and not in a call, you can press and hold the record key to mute the incoming call ring, or press and hold the volume keys to reject the call.

#### ◆ When Auto Answer Enabled

You can set the auto answer mode to **Immediate answer**, **Message** or **Recorded message**.


For details, refer to "Settings/Call settings/Auto Answer". The following describes how the phone will react in different auto answer modes:


To...	Operation
Answer a call	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If the auto answer mode is <b>Immediate answer</b>, the phone will auto answer a call in 5 seconds.</li> <li>• If the auto answer mode is <b>Text message</b>, the phone will send a predefined message to the caller in 20 seconds.</li> <li>• If the auto answer mode is <b>Recorded message</b>, the phone will play a predefined audio file to the caller in 20 seconds.</li> </ul>
End a call	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If the headset is not in use, you can end a call by closing the phone or by pressing .</li> <li>• If the headset is in use, you can press the control key on the headset.</li> </ul>

## Operations During a Call

### Icon Description

#### ◆ Icon Description

 : A call is ongoing.

 : The call is on hold.

 : There is a new incoming call during a call.

### Operations

#### ◆ Hold/Resume

During a call, select **Options** > **Hold** to hold the call. To resume the call, select **Options** > **Resume**.



#### ◆ Answer/Reject

Your phone allows you to handle two calls simultaneously.

During a call, if there is a new incoming call, the icon blinks and the caller information appears on the screen:



## Operations During a Call

- Press  or select **Options > Answer** to answer it.
- Press  or select **Options > Reject** to reject it.

### ◆ Swap


During a 3-party call, select **Options > Swap** to swap between calls.

### ◆ Conference call/Private call

During a 3-party call, select **Options > Conference call** to switch to the conference call.

During a conference call, select **Options > Private call** to talk with a party privately.

### ◆ Handfree/Earpiece

During a call, press  to switch between the Hands-free and the Earpiece modes.

### ◆ Mute

During a call, select **Mute** to mute your voice. To resume the conversation, select **Unmute**.

### ◆ End a Call


During a 3-party call or a conference call, select:

- **Options > End > All calls** to end the call with all parties.
- **Options > End > current call** to end the active call.

During a 3-party call, you can select:

- **Options > End > On hold** to end the call that is on hold.
- **Options > End > Activate call** to end the active call.

### ◆ New Call

During a call, you can enter a phone number through the keypad or select a contact, and then press  or select **Options > New call** to make a 3-party call.

### ◆ Start Record/Stop Record

During a call, you can select **Options > Start record** to record the conversation.

To stop recording, select **Options > Stop record**.

### ◆ Other Applications

During a call, select:





- **Options > Other Apps > Messaging** to access the inbox.
- **Options > Other Apps > Contacts** to access the phonebook.
- **Options > Other Apps > Call Log** to access the call log.

## 4 Text Input

You can use the keypad to enter alphanumeric characters and symbols. For example, you can add entries to the contacts, write messages or schedule events on the calendar.

### Note

While entering text:

- Press  to switch between input methods, including "abc", "Abc", "ABC", and numbers.
- Press  to enable or disable T9 input method.
- Press  to display the commonly-used symbols list. You can use the scroll keys to select.
- Press  to delete the letter before the cursor.

### T9 Input Method






With the T9 input method, you can easily and quickly enter words with predictive text scheme.

- Press each key carrying the desired letter once, and then the predictive text scheme will present the


candidate words composed by the letters you have entered in the drop-down menu.

- After entering all letters, if there is not the expected one in the drop-down menu, you can select [**Spell**] to enter the desired letter using the traditional input method and then select **Insert**. The words you inserted will be saved in the predictive text dictionary. If the dictionary is full, the new word replaces the oldest one.

For example, to enter the word "good" with the T9 input method, follow these steps.

- 1 Press successively the keys , , , and  which "g", "o", "o", and "d" belong to, and the candidate words composed by these letters will be shown in the drop-down menu.
- 2 Use the up/down scroll key to select "good". Then press  to enter a space for entering the next word.



### Note

Press  repeatedly and you will see "T9 english", "T9 English" and "T9 ENGLISH" on the upper left corner of the screen successively. It indicates the words to be


entered will be in lower case, first letter capitalized or in upper case.

### Traditional Input Method


When T9 input method is off, you can use the traditional input method for entering alphabetic characters. Repeatedly press the key that carries the letter to be entered when it appears on the screen. For example, to enter the word "Hello" with the traditional input method, follow these steps.

- 1 Press  that carries "h" repeatedly and all letters carried by this key will be displayed successively on the screen. Stop when you see an "h" on the screen.
- 2 After entering the first letter, you can directly press another key (except ) to enter the next letter. If the next desired letter is on the same key as the current one, wait until the cursor appears to the right of the current letter and then you can enter the next one.
- 3 Enter "e", "l", "l" and "o" in the same way.

#### Note

- Press  repeatedly and you will see "abc", "Abc" or "ABC" on the upper left corner of the screen successively. It indicates the words to be entered will be in lower case, first letter capitalized or in upper case.
- Press and hold number keys to enter numbers.


### "123" Numeric Input Method

With the "123" numeric input method, you can enter corresponding numeric characters by pressing the character/number keys. For example, to enter "1" with the "123" numeric input method, you can press . Then "1" appears on the screen.

## ■ Symbol Input Method

### Symbol Input Method

Your Vodafone 710 provides an independent symbol input method.




For example, to enter ":" with the symbol input method, you can just press the scroll keys to select ":" in the symbol list and then press .

### Input Different Languages


In a text editing screen, select **Options > Input language** to set the language for the text. The selected language will be displayed on the upper middle part of the editing screen.

## 5 Using the Menu

Your phone provides an extensive range of functions. You can use these functions by navigating the following menus: Entertainment, Music, Call Log, Vodafone Live!, Messaging, My Files, Organiser & Tools, Contacts and Settings.




- 1 In the standby mode, press  to display the main menu.
- 2 Press the scroll key to scroll through the menu, and then press  to select.
- 3 If the menu contains further submenus, repeat step 2.
- 4 Use the selected function according to the prompts on the screen.
- 5 Select **Back** to return to the previous menu. Press  to return to the standby mode.

## 6 Contacts

**Contacts**  enables you to save and manage such information as phone numbers and addresses of your contacts. You can save such information in your phone or your SIM card. You can also assign eight frequently-used numbers to speed dialing keys for your convenience.

### Creating SMS/MMS/Email

You can create a message, a MMS or an email and send it to a contact.

- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Phone**  or **SIM** .
- 2 Select **Options > Create**, and then select **SMS**, **MMS** or **Email** to send it to the selected contact.

### Making Calls from the Contacts

You can make a voice/video call with a contact selected from the contacts list.




- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Phone**  or **SIM** .

- 2 Select a contact and select **Options > Call**. Then, you can select **Voice Call** or **Video Call** to make a call. Alternatively, you can select **Edit before call** to edit the number before making the call.

### Adding a New Contact




For each contact to be added in your phone, you can add the name, mobile phone number, office telephone, home telephone, address, email address, fax number and country of the contact. You can also set an icon and a ring tone for each contact.

For each contact to be added in the SIM card, you can add the name and phone number, and depending on your SIM card type, also the fax number and email address.

- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Phone**  or **SIM** .
- 2 Select **Options > New**.
- 3 Enter the contact information and then select **Options > Save**.

## Deleting a Contact

You can delete a contact from your phone or SIM card.

- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Phone**  or **SIM** .
- 2 Select the contact to delete. select **Options** > **Mark/Unmark** to tick the checkbox on the right of the contact or cancel the selection.
- 3 Select **Options** > **Delete marked**. At the prompt, select Yes to confirm or No to cancel.

## Searching for a Contact

You can find a contact from the contacts list easily and quickly by using this function on both the **Phone** screen and the **SIM** screen.




- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Phone**  or **SIM** .
- 2 Select **Options** > **Search**.

- 3 Select **Options** > **Search**, and then enter the contact name you are searching for. The contact will be displayed.

### Note

The search result will include all matched contacts from both the phone and SIM memories, no matter from which screen (Phone or SIM) you start searching.

You can also use quick search in the **Phone** or **SIM** screen:

- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Phone**  or **SIM** .
- 2 Enter a string (one or more letters or numbers) contained in the contact name you are searching for (which is displayed at the bottom of the screen). Then the contacts whose names contain this string will be displayed.






## ■ Copying Contacts

You can also find a contact by entering the initials of the first name and the last name of the contact. For example, to find a contact named "Alice Green", enter the initials "ag". This contact will be displayed in the candidate list.

### Copying Contacts

You can copy one or more contacts from your phone to the SIM card or from your SIM card to the phone.

- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Phone**  or **SIM** .
- 2 Select a contact to transfer. Select **Options** > **Mark/Unmark** to tick the checkbox to the right of the contact or cancel the selection.
- 3 Select **Options** > **Copy marked to SIM** or **Copy marked to phone**. At the prompt, select **Yes** to confirm or **No** to cancel.

#### Note

Not all contact details will get transferred when copying a contact from the phone to the SIM card. Usually this the name, the first

number and the e-mail address but it depends on the SIM card type.




### Sending a Contact

You can send a contact to other devices supporting SMS or Bluetooth. Before sending by Bluetooth, you need to switch on the Bluetooth device.

You can send only one contact by SMS each time. When sending by SMS, the information can include the contact name, phone number and email address. Other information (such as home address) cannot be sent by SMS.




### Marking/Unmarking a Contact

You can select one or more contacts in your phone and SIM card.

- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Phone**  or **SIM** .
- 2 Select **Options** > **Mark/Unmark** to tick the checkbox to the right of the entry or cancel the selection.

### My Business Card



You can save your own information such as your name, mobile phone number, office telephone number, fax number, and email address to a Business Card. You can send the information by message or Bluetooth.

- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Phone**  or **SIM** .
- 2 Select **Options > My business card**.

### Backing Up Contacts





You can back up your contacts by copying them from your phone to a memory card or from your memory card to your phone. You can also synchronize contacts in the phone with your personal phone book stored on the Vodafone network. Note that this service is not available in all networks. Please check

- 3 Select a speed dial key for the contact, and then press .

## ■ Viewing the Memory Status

### Viewing the Memory Status

You can view the memory status of both your phone and SIM card, including the number of existing contacts and the total capacity of the phone and the SIM card.

- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Phone**  or **SIM** .
- 2 Select **Options** > **Memory status** to view the memory status.

### Settings

This option is used to sort the contacts in the phone and the SIM card or to set an alert before saving.




### Groups

You can rename a group, add group members, or delete a group.

## Adding/Deleting Group Members

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You can add a member to a group in your phone or delete a member from it.

- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Groups**.
- 2 Select a group and press  to view the details.
- 3 Select **Option** > **Add**. Select a contact and press . The member you added will be displayed in the group member list.

To delete a group member, select a member from the group member list, and then select **Options** > **Delete**.

## Managing a Group

---

- 1 In the **Contacts**  screen, press the left/right scroll key to select **Groups**.
- 2 Select a group and select **Options** for the following options.
  - Details: to view the details of a group.

- **Create:** to send a text message or MMS to all members of a group.
- **Rename:** to change the name of a group.
- **Delete:** to delete a group and all members of the group.








### Note

You cannot rename or delete any group preset in your phone.





# 7 Call Log

The recently dialed calls, received calls and missed calls are saved automatically on your phone to make it easy to refer to them.

## Making Calls from Call Log

- 1 Select **Call Log**  in the main menu and then press the left/right scroll key to switch between **All calls** , **Missed** , **Received**  and **Dialed** .
- 2 Press the up/down scroll key to select a record. Press  to make a voice call or press  to make a video call.

## Other Operations

Press the left/right scroll key to select **All calls** , **Missed** , **Received**  or **Dialed** . Then select **Options** for the following options.

Call	To make a voice call or a video call. Alternatively, you can select <b>Edit before call</b> to edit the number before making a call.
Create	To send a message or MMS.

Display mode	You can select <b>Normal</b> to display all records or select <b>Simple</b> to ignore the repeated records.

# 8 Messaging

## Text Messages




The maximum content for a single text message is 160 English letters. If the characters you entered exceed this limit, the text will be divided into two or more continuous messages for sending.

### Creating a text Message

- 1 Select **Messaging**  > **New SMS** the main menu.
- 2 In the message editing screen, select **Options**:
  - T9 Switch: enable or disable T9 input method.
  - Input mode: You may select one of the input methods to enter the message contents.
  - Common phrases: You can use these to speed up the text entry.
  - Insert number: You can insert a phone number saved on the phone or the SIM card.
  - Input language: You can select a language for this message.
- 3 After editing the message, press  to access the "Edit numbers" screen.

- Enter the phone number, and then select **Options** > **Send** or press  to send the message.
- Select **Options** > **Group** or **Contacts** to choose a number and send the message.
- Select **Options** > **Save** to save the message.





### SMS Mailboxes



The phone provides three mailboxes for SMS, namely, Inbox , Outbox  and Draft .

#### ◆ Inbox





You can save the received messages in **Inbox**.

1 Select **Messaging > SMS > Drafts** .

2 Press the up/down scroll key to select a message and press  to edit it.

#### Other Operations for the Draft

1 Select **Messaging > SMS > Drafts** .

## Multimedia Messages

- 2 Select Options, and then you can do the same operations as those of **Outbox**. You can also edit the selected messages.

## SMS Settings

---

You can change the SMS settings by performing the following steps.

- 1 Select **Messaging > Settings > SMS** from the main menu.
- 2 Set the parameters related to messages:
  - Message centre: Your Vodafone 710 can auto read the number of the message centre from the SIM card or the phone. If you have deleted the information by accident, contact Vodafone.
  - Message validity : The time a message is kept in the message centre after it is sent.
  - Auto save: You can set whether a message will be saved automatically to **Outbox** when it is sent.
  - Save location: To set the position for saving newly created messages, received messages, and sent messages.


- Signature: To set whether your signature will be sent along with the message. You can edit the signature while creating a new message.
- Status report: You can set it to On or Off. If you set it to On, the network will send you the information on whether the message has reached the recipient.
- Concatenate SMS: You can set it to On or Off. If you set it to Off, you cannot edit and send messages longer than the limits of a single SMS.


## Multimedia Messages


You can send messages attached with images, text and music under this mode.

## Creating a Multimedia Message


---


- 1 Select **Messaging**  **> New MMS** from the main menu.
- 2 Select To, Cc or Bcc.


- Select an entry from the recipients list, and then press  or select **Options > Edit** to enter a phone number.
- Select a position from the recipients list, select **Options > Contact** or **Group**, and then select phone numbers.


**3** Select **Back** to go back to the "Edit MMS" screen, select **Subject** to enter text as subject, and then press .


**4** Select **Content** to edit the pages.

(1) Select  to access the text entry field, and then edit text.

(2) Select  to enter the image-editing field and then you can select images or video files in **My Files**.

(3) Select  to enter the music-editing field and then you can select audio files in **My Files**.

(4) Access the field indicated by  and press the left/right scroll key to select one from different pages if there are more pages.

(5) Access the field indicated by  and press the left/right scroll key to adjust the playing time of the current page.

(6) You can select **Options**, then select **Edit**, **Send to**, **Remove object**, **Insert page**, **Delete page**, **Preview** for the multimedia pages.

**5** Go back to the "Edit MMS" screen, Select **Options** for the following operations:





- Send: to send this multimedia message.
- Save: to save this message to Messaging/MMS/Drafts.
- Add to template: to save this message at Messaging/MMS/Templates.
- Send settings: to set relevant sending parameters for sending multimedia messages. For details, please refer to "Messaging/Settings/MMS Settings" on page 41.
- Size: to view the size of this multimedia message.

## Multimedia Messages

### Note

- From the recipients list window select phone numbers you need for To, Cc or Bcc. Then select Options, you can set the phone number to Set To, Set Cc or Set Bcc. Meanwhile you may also select Delete or Delete all to delete the selected numbers or all numbers.
- If the video file is chosen in the image-editing field, you cannot edit the music-editing field any more.

- 1 Access Drafts and select a multimedia message.
- 2 Press  to enter the editing screen.
- 3 Now you can edit the message. The operations are the same as those for creating a multimedia message.

#### Other Operations for the Drafts


- 1 Access the Drafts  of the MMS.
- 2 Select Options, and you can perform the following operations:
  - Edit: to edit the selected multimedia message.
  - Mark: to choose the current multimedia message.
  - New MMS: to create a new multimedia message.

- Delete: to delete the selected multimedia messages.
- Move: to move the selected multimedia messages to a specified folder.
- Folder: to save the multimedia messages you moved.
- Sort: to sort the messages in the Drafts by recipients or by date.
- Unmark all: to unmark all the multimedia messages in the Drafts.
- Mark all: to mark all the multimedia messages in the Drafts.
- Memory status: to view the memory status of multimedia messages, including the occupied memory of every mailbox, Template, Folder, and that of total.

### ◆ Sent

The **Sent** is used to save the multimedia messages that have been sent successfully.


#### Icons in Sent

: A multimedia message has been sent.

### Viewing Messages in Sent

- 1 Select a multimedia message to view its contents.
- 2 During playing, you can select **Stop** to stop playing.
- 3 During playing, you may select **Options** to do the same operations as those of MMS Inbox. Refer to "Messaging/MMS/MMS Mailboxes" on page 38.

### Other Operations for the Sent

- 1 Access the **Sent**  of the **MMS**.
- 2 Select **Options** and you can do the same operations as those of MMS Inbox. Refer to "Messaging/MMS/MMS Mailboxes" on page 38.

#### ◆ **Templates**


To send messages quickly, you can turn the content of commonly used multimedia messages into samples and save them. All operations on the **Templates** menu are basically the same as those for the **Drafts**. Please refer to "Drafts" on page 40 for details.

#### ◆ **Folder**

You can categorize your multimedia messages into different folders.

You can access **Folder** from the four tabs of **Inbox**, **Drafts**, **Sent** or **Template**. The management of the **Folder** is similar to that for the **Drafts** or **Template**. Please refer to these sections for details.

Now let us take entering the **Inbox** screen as an example.

Select **MMS > Inbox** . Then select **Options > Folder**. You can perform the following operations.

- **Rename**: to rename a folder.
- **Select**: to access a folder. Operations for this folder are similar to those for the **Drafts** or **Templates**.

### MMS Settings

Select **Messaging > Settings > MMS**, and then you can set parameters related to multimedia messages. It contains the following submenus.

#### ◆ **Sending**

This option is used to set parameters related to sending multimedia messages.



## ■ Creating MMS Postcards

- **Send report:** You have two alternatives, On and Off. With this mode enabled (On), the network will report on successfully sending a multimedia message.
- **Read report:** To set whether to accept a read report.
- **Send limit:** To set the size limit of a multimedia message to be sent.
- **Save on send:** To decide whether a multimedia message will be saved to the Sent folder after it has been sent.
- **Sender visibility:** To set whether the sender information will be displayed when a multimedia message is sent.

### ◆ Retrieval




This option is used to set parameters related to retrieval of multimedia messages.


- **Send delivery report:** You have two alternatives, On and Off. With this mode enabled (On), the network will reply to the sender's multimedia message

with a report indicating that you have received the message.

- **Send read report:** To set whether to send a read report.
  - **Retrieval limit:** To set the size limit of a multimedia message that you can receive.
  - **Auto retrieval:** To set whether the phone automatically receives multimedia messages or not.
- Settings such as "Network Access Point" and "WAP gateway" are all pre-set for your convenience.

## Creating MMS Postcards





Use this option to get Vodafone to print out a photo you have selected and send it by post to the recipient. From the Messaging menu, choose the New postcard menu and press  . Select the photo you want to send and press  . Then press Insert and choose the High Resolution format if requested. Type out the message you would like printed on the postcard and press  . Enter the recipient's name, address, post code and city (and

optionally county and Country) using  to move through the options.

Finally, to send the postcard press **Options > Send**.






It is used to save the trusted Push message number.

### ◆ Push Blacklist

It is used to save the un-trusted Push message number.


## Broadcast Inbox

The broadcast messages are saved in the broadcast inbox. You can set the broadcast message.

Select **Messaging > Setting > Broadcast** to set the following items.

- **Service:** to enable or disable this service.
- **Subscription:** to subscribe to broadcast channels or cancel the subscription.
- **Language:** to select the language of the broadcast.
- **Silent alert:** to set whether to use an alert when there is a new broadcast message.
- **Auto delete:** to set whether to auto delete earlier messages when the broadcast inbox memory is full.

## Voice Mail Number

The voice mail number is already pre-set for you in the phone. To access your voicemail, press and hold  in standby mode, the phone will dial out the voice mail number automatically.


## Common Phrases

Your Vodafone 710 has been preset with some commonly used phrases for inputting message, sending messages while answering a call and auto replying. You can edit them if you want.

- 1** Select **Messaging > Settings > Common phrases**.
- 2** Select the phrase to be modified and then select **Modify**.



# 9 Music

**Music**  enables you to manage your music files easily and conveniently. It enables you to purchase a huge variety of up to date music from Vodafone. Vodafone offers a great variety of Music which is always up to date.

## My Music

You can play various music files, including those supplied with the phone, recorded by yourself with the phone, downloaded from the Internet, and attached to email. You can also enjoy the online audio files.

### Function Options During Playing









During playing the music file, Select **Options** for the following operations.

Options	Description
Open file	To select and play the music files in your phone.
Full screen	To play the video file in full screen.

Options	Description
Mute/ Unmute	To mute or unmute the music
Playlist	To access the music playlist.
Book- marks	To access the bookmark list. You can select and access the existed URL or new stream media address to play stream media files.
Video camera	To enable the video camera function.
History	To record the played music information.
Send	To send the music file through messages, Email or Bluetooth.
Set as	To set the music file as voice tone, video tone or contact tone.
Property	To view the information of the music files.
Settings	To set the play mode, full screen direction, and Stream setting.

## Screen Operations During Playing

During playing the music file, you can execute the following operations on the music file.

Operation	Description
	Press the up scroll key to play the previous music file.
	Press the down scroll key to play the next music file.
	Press the right scroll key to fast forward the music file.
	Press the left scroll key to rewind the music file.
	Press  to pause the playing. Press  again to resume the playing.
	Press the volume keys to adjust the volume.

**Note**

When a call is coming:

- If a music file is being played, the music file continues to play from where it was interrupted after the call.
- If the music has been paused, the music file stays in the paused state after the call.

## Playlist


Selecting this option, you can rename and edit the playlist as well as play the music in the playlist.

## Vodafone Radio DJ

Vodafone Radio DJ is a service which provides you a selection of different music channels for you to choose similar to Radio. If you skip tracks on a channel you listen to, the service will realise the kind of music you are skipping and then not offer it again on this channel. Also you can very easily mark music tracks you like to download them later on. You can do the following operations.

- My Channels: To create or edit the existed channels. Select **Options** to edit, create, rename, or delete user-defined channels.

## ■ Music Store

- RDJ Channels: Here you find a selection of different music channels for you to choose. Select a channel and then press  to display the music playlist contained in this channel.
- RDJ Collections: In this area you find specific music collections like the "best of hits" of an artist.
- My Account: To display and purchase the playing time for streaming media. This will also be displayed automatically when your account balance is too low for a channel or music album you have selected.


## Music Store

In the Vodafone Music Store you can find a great variety of music for you to download onto your mobile phone.

## My Wishlist

On your music wishlist you will find all the songs which you have marked to download while listening to a Radio DJ channel.

# 10 Organiser & Tools

This function provides you with various assistant tools, including SIM ToolKit, Alarm clock, Calendar, Calculator, Unit converter, Currency converter, Synchronise, Tasks, Voice recorder, Memo, World Time, Stopwatch, Timer and Service dial number. You can access the **Organiser & Tools** screen by selecting  from the main menu.

## SIM ToolKit

Your Vodafone 710 supports a number of clever Sim ToolKit (STK) functions such as location based services. For more information, consult Vodafone.


## Alarm Clock

You can set several alarm clocks. You can also set the prompt messages, alarm tones and the cycle period for alarm clocks.

### Setting Alarm Clocks

---

You can set an alarm clock as follows:

- 1 Select one alarm from the list, and press  to set an alarm clock.
- 2 Set the alarm time.
- 3 Enter the prompt message.
- 4 Select a ringtone. Your phone provides standard ringtones and supports downloaded ringtones.
- 5 Set the alarm cycle.
- 6 Select whether to enable snooze.
- 7 Select whether to vibrate when the time for an alarm clock is up.
- 8 Select whether to set the alarm tone.
- 9 Press the left function key to start the alarm clock.

### Prompt Interface for an Alarm

---

When it is time for an alarm clock to ring, the selected alarm tone is played and a prompt interface is displayed. You can stop the ringing by pressing any key or by closing or opening your phone. On the prompt

interface, you can select to snooze or stop the alarm prompt.

- **Snooze:** On the prompt interface, press the right function key to snooze the alarm. Then the alarm will ring again in five minutes. You can snooze the alarm three times.
- **Stop:** On the prompt interface, press the left function key to stop the alarm clock. Then the alarm clock will not ring again.

If your phone is powered off, the alarm clock can still ring, and you will be prompted whether to power on the phone when it rings.

### Stopping the Alarm Clock


Select an alarm clock from the list, and press the left function key to deactivate it.

## Calendar

With this function, you can view the calendar and manage your schedules.

## New Schedule

### ◆ Ways to Create Schedules

### ◆ Creating a Schedule

In the screen for editing schedule, you can set the following items: schedule title, schedule location,

schedule type, start/end time of the schedule, whether to alarm, when to alarm before the start time, alarm cycle, schedule details, alarm tone, and image files.

**Note** You can create up to 500 schedules in total and 15 for each day. While creating a new schedule, you need to set to alarm before setting the alarm time, the alarm cycle, the alarm tone and the image.

## Prompt Interface for a Schedule

When it is time to remind you of a schedule, the selected ringtone is played and a prompt interface is

displayed. You can stop the ringing by pressing any key or by closing or opening your phone. On the prompt interface, you can select to snooze or stop the prompt.

- Snooze: On the prompt interface, press the right function key to snooze. Then you will be prompted again after five minutes. The prompt will always snooze until you stop it.
- Stop: On the prompt interface, press the left function key to stop the prompt. Then you will not be prompted any more.

## Calculator

You can perform addition, subtraction, multiplication, division and extraction operations on your phone.


- Press the number keys to enter the figures.
- Press the scroll key to enter the operators.
- Press the left function key to clear.
- Press the right function key to exit Calculator.
- Press  to enter a radix point.
- Press  to delete the character on the left of the cursor.

- Press  to perform extraction.
- Press  to enter an equal mark.

## Unit Converter

You can convert units of length and weight between different systems on your phone.

- 1 Press the up/down scroll key to select the unit type bar, input unit bar or output unit bar.
- 2 On the unit type selection bar, press the left/right scroll key to select weight or length.
- 3 On the **From** bar, press the left/right scroll key to select the unit to be converted from.
- 4 On the **To** bar, press the left/right scroll key to select the unit to be converted to.
- 5 Press the number keys to enter a numeric value in the number bar.  
Then you can view the conversion result.


Press  or select CE to clear the numeric values you entered.

## Currency Converter

You can convert between different currencies on your phone.


To using this function, access the **Currency converter** screen, and then press the up/down scroll key to switch between the setup items.


- 1 On the **Input** bar, press the number keys to enter a numeric value to be converted.
- 2 On the **From** bar, press the left/right scroll key to select the currency to be converted from.
- 3 On the **To** bar, press the left/right scroll key to select the currency to be converted to.
- 4 On the **Rate** bar, enter the currency rate. Then you can view the conversion result.

Press  to clear the numeric values you entered. Press **Setting** in the currency converter screen, and you can select frequently used currency units. This makes it easy to switch between selected units in the **From** or **To** bar.

## Synchronise

You can synchronise contacts with your personal phone book stored on the Vodafone network. This service might not be available in all Vodafone networks. Contact Vodafone for further details.

Select **Synchronise** from **Organiser & Tools**  to create or edit a profile. Select **Options > View log** to view the latest synchronisation log. Before you use the synchronise function, you may need to set a profile.

- 1 To create a profile, select **Options > New** to create a profile.
- 2 Press the left/right scroll key to switch between Synchronise Item, Server Setting, and Network Profile.
- 3 In the **Synchronise Item** screen, select the item to be synchronized and press  to confirm it. Then, enter the database path, User name, Password of the synchronization items.
- 4 In the **Server Setting** screen, enter the user

name, password, server URL and port .


- 5 In the **Network profile** screen, enter the proxy server address and the port. Then, enter the network access point and select a desired profile.
- 6 Return to the previous menu and select **Options > Synchronise** to start synchronising.

### Note

Note that this service is not available on all networks. Please contact Vodafone for more information.


## Tasks

You can define and manage tasks to be conducted before a certain time. Your phone can remind you of these tasks and track them automatically.

Select **Tasks** from **Organiser & Tools** . The tasks are classified into three kinds: pending, done, and all. You can define up to 1000 tasks on your phone.

## New Tasks

---

To define a new task, press  or select **Options > New** on the Tasks screen. Then proceed with the following steps:

- 1 Enter the title of the task.
- 2 Set the deadline.
- 3 Set the priority level.
- 4 Set the accomplishment status of the task.
- 5 Select whether to alert.  
If you select alert, you need to set the time for alert.
- 6 Set the alert time of the task.  
If you select not to alert, skip this step.
- 7 Set the type of the task.
- 8 Press the left function key to save it.

## Other Operations on the Tasks Screen

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On the Tasks screen, you can also perform the following operations: delete, edit, copy, mark finished,

day view, send by Message, Email or Bluetooth, view the memory status and delete all.

## Operations on the Task Prompt Interface

---

When it is time for the phone to remind you of a task, it rings automatically and a prompt interface is displayed. You can stop the ringing by pressing any key or by folding/unfolding your phone. On the prompt interface, you can select to snooze or stop the task prompt.

- Snooze: On the prompt interface, press the right function key to snooze the alarm clock. Then the phone will ring after five minutes. The prompt will always snooze until you stop it.
- Stop: On the prompt interface, press the left function key to stop the ringing and close the prompt interface. Then the phone will not ring any more.


## Voice Recorder

You can record voices or sounds on your phone. You can set the recording duration.

Select **Organiser & Tools > Voice recorder** from the main menu, then you can execute the following operations.



## Preparations Before Recording

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- 1** Set the duration: On the standby screen of the voice recorder, select **Options > Duration** to set the duration.
- 2** View records: On the standby screen of the voice recorder, select **Options > Gallery** to view the audio files.
- 3** Start recording: On the standby screen of the voice recorder, press  or select **Option > Record** to start recording.

## Operations During Recording

---

- 1** Pause: During recording, press  to pause, and press  again to resume.
- 2** Stop and save: During recording, press the left function key to stop recording.

## Memo Pad


The audio file is saved in **My Files\Music** automatically.

- 3 Play an audio file instantly: After recording is finished, select **Option > Play** to play the audio file instantly.

Alternatively, you can select **Options** for the following operations: send by Message, Email or Bluetooth, set as tone and delete.

## Memo Pad

You can take down important events on your phone. You can save up to 100 such memos.

Select **Memo** from **Organiser & Tools** . If there is no memo, you need to create one when you access the **Memo** screen.

On the Memo Pad screen, you can perform the following operations: new, delete, edit, send by Message or Bluetooth, view the memory status and delete all.

## World Time

You can view the time of important cities around the world.


To switch among the time zones, press the left/right scroll key.

If the daylight saving time (DST) is used in your city, you need to set to DST. Then, you can get the right local time. To set to DST, switch to the desired time zone and then select **Options > DST**.

## Stopwatch

You can use the stopwatch function and save up to five records on your phone.

- Start: Press the left function key to start timing.
- Lap: Press the left function key to save the first record of timing. Timing for the second record starts automatically. You can go on timing and saving in this way until five records are saved. Then the stopwatch is stopped.
- Pause: Press the right function key during timing to pause.

- Continue: Press  or select **Options > Continue** to resume timing.
- Reset: In the state of pause, select **Options > Reset** to clear all the stopwatch records.

## Timer


You can set a timer for up to 99 hours and 59 minutes. After you have set it, the timer is displayed on the home screen.

## Enter URL

# 13 Video Call



Video calling is one of the major features of the 3G network, enabling you to see as well as hear when calling.




## Functions on the Screen

During a video call, the phone displays the phone number of the other party, call duration, and available options.

During a video call, you can press  to hold the call and send a preset file to the other party. You can press  again to resume the call. Before you use the function, you can preset a file in **settings/video call/Send freeze image**.

You can also adjust the following settings:

## Video Camera

You can use your phone to record a video.

In the main menu, select **Entertainment > Camera > Options > Video camera** to launch the video camera.

### Operations in the Viewfinder Screen

## Operations During Recording

# 15 Connections

Your Vodafone 710 provides you with many data communication functions. You can access the **connect** screen by selecting Settings  from the main menu. You can synchronise data between your phone and a PC through USB cable or Bluetooth. You can transfer files between your phone and other Bluetooth devices. You can also use the built-in modem of your phone to establish a dialup connection for your PC to access the Internet.

## Bluetooth

You may use the built-in Bluetooth function of your phone to synchronise data between a PC and your phone, or use the built-in modem of your phone to access the Internet with a PC, or exchange data with other Bluetooth devices. You can also talk using the Bluetooth headset or Bluetooth loudspeaker.

### Note

The Bluetooth function supported by your Vodafone 710 meets the requirements of Bluetooth Specification 1.1. However, how successfully it works depends upon the compatibility of the Bluetooth devices you

use with it. For more information, refer to the user manuals of related devices, or consult the manufacturer of related devices.

## Bluetooth-Based Synchronisation

---

Your Vodafone 710 can respond to data synchronisation requests from a computer.

With the Bluetooth technology and the *Vodafone 710 MOBILE PHONE PC Assistant* supplied with your phone, the phone can communicate with a PC. You can backup and edit the contact entries and short messages saved on your phone and SIM card to a PC. You can also synchronise contact entries, schedule events and To Do tasks between your phone and Outlook . In addition, with the Memo Pad of your phone, you can receive and send Outlook mails by Bluetooth.

Follow these steps to operate the Bluetooth synchronisation with your Vodafone 710 phone.

- 1 Your PC needs to support Bluetooth function. If not, see page 81 on how to use a USB connection.

- 2 Install the *Vodafone 710 MOBILE PHONE PC Assistant* supplied with your phone: Insert the disk and select **Install Vodafone PC Assistant** and then click **Continue**. Then follow the guide to complete the installation.
- 3 Select **Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth > Switch On/Off > On** to enable the Bluetooth function.
- 4 Run the driver software for Bluetooth on the PC, and pair the Vodafone 710 phone. After the PC detects and recognises the Vodafone 710 serial port service, activate the Bluetooth serial port service of the Vodafone 710.
- 5 Run the *Vodafone 710 MOBILE PHONE PC Assistant* on the PC.
- 6 Now you can operate the synchronisation. For details of the operation, refer to the Help of the *Vodafone 710 MOBILE PHONE PC Assistant*.

## The Bluetooth Headset

---

You can answer a call by a Bluetooth headset or Bluetooth loudspeaker. For details, refer to the corresponding user manual of a Bluetooth headset or loudspeaker.

Select **Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth** to access the Bluetooth Settings screen.

To use a Bluetooth headset, follow these steps.

- 1 Set the Bluetooth headset to the status for detecting.
- 2 Select **Switch On/Off > On** from the Bluetooth settings list to enable the device. A Bluetooth device icon appears on the icon bar.
- 3 Select **Devices** and then select **Search**. When the Bluetooth headset has been found, its profile will be displayed in the device list.
- 4 If a Bluetooth headset is detected and recognised for the first time, it should be authenticated by PIN code.

To authenticate the Bluetooth headset, follow these steps.

## Bluetooth

- 1 Select the found Bluetooth headset and select **Options > Pair**.
- 2 Enter the Bluetooth PIN code of the headset. It should be provided by the headset manufacturer.
- 3 Select the paired Bluetooth headset and select **Options > Connect**.
- 4 If the connection is successful, a headset icon will be shown on the icon bar.

**Note** Only when authentication is needed should the Bluetooth headset be set to the status for detecting. Once the headset has been authenticated, you just need to turn on your Bluetooth headset. For more information, refer to the user manual of your Bluetooth headset.

Now you can use the Bluetooth headset as the connection has been established between your phone and the Bluetooth headset. On the **Devices** screen, the left function key is for the following operations.

- **Connect/Disconnect:** You can connect or disconnect the Bluetooth headset with your phone.
- **Pair:** You can enter the Bluetooth PIN code of the headset.
- **Set as trusted/Set as untrusted:** You can set the Bluetooth headset as a trusted device. You do not need to authenticate this device for the next time of use.
- **Rename:** You can rename the Bluetooth headset.
- **Delete:** You can delete the Bluetooth headset from the device list.
- **Device Details:** You can view the detailed information of the Bluetooth headset.
- **Search:** You can search for another Bluetooth device.

### Note

- The device list will keep the information of all authenticated devices. If your Bluetooth headset is used for the first time, you need to enter the PIN code for authentication. From then on you can use the headset directly.
- The way for using a Bluetooth loud-speaker is similar to that for a Bluetooth

headset. For details, refer to the user manual supplied with your Bluetooth loudspeaker.

- Only when the connection has been established can you adjust the volume of the Bluetooth headset.

## Bluetooth-Based Data Transfer

---

You can exchange data between your Bluetooth phone and other Bluetooth devices.

- 1** Select **Switch On/Off > On** from the Bluetooth settings list to enable the Bluetooth device. A Bluetooth device icon will appear on the icon bar.
- 2** Select **Devices list**.
- 3** Select **Options > Search** to search a Bluetooth device. When a Bluetooth device is found for the first time, authentication is required.

To authenticate this Bluetooth device, follow these steps.

- 1** Select the Bluetooth device that you want to exchange data with and then select **Options > Pair**.
- 2** The initiator of the data exchange enters the PIN code that is agreed by the two parties to invite the other party to establish a connection. On the invitation, the invited party should enter the same PIN code.
- 3** If the authentication is successful, the connection will be established between your phone and the other Bluetooth device.

Now you can exchange data between your phone and the other Bluetooth device.

### Note

- Data that can be exchanged by Bluetooth includes the contact entries, Memo Pad records, schedule events and To Do tasks as well as such media files as images, videos, music, ringtones and various data files in **My Files**.
- If you want to exchange data between your phone and another device, that

device must support Bluetooth and the Bluetooth function must be enabled.

- In transferring data by Bluetooth, the received contacts, Memo Pad records, schedule events and To Do tasks will be saved to Contacts, Memo Pad and To Do, and other media and data files will be saved to the corresponding folders in **My Files**.

### Bluetooth-Based Internet Access

---

Connecting your phone to a PC through Bluetooth function enables the PC to use the phone as a modem to establish a dial-up connection to the Internet. (This is particularly useful for laptops.)

You can create Bluetooth-based Internet access through the Vodafone Mobile Phone PC Assistant supplied with Vodafone 710, or the built-in Internet wizard of the Windows operating system, or the Internet wizard supplied with the Bluetooth drive suite of the PC.

#### Note

Windows 2000 and Windows XP are supported.

#### ◆ Accessing the Internet using the Vodafone Mobile Phone PC Assistant

To access the Internet by Bluetooth using the Vodafone Mobile Phone PC Assistant, follow these steps.

- 1 Make sure that your PC supports the Bluetooth function and your SIM card allows the Internet access service.
- 2 Select **Settings > Connectivity > Modem** and set the port to **Modem via Bluetooth**.
- 3 Select **Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth > Switch On/Off > On**.
- 4 Make sure that **Bluetooth modem** is in **Device Manager/Modem** of your PC. Run the driver program for Bluetooth on your PC, and then pair the Vodafone 710 phone. After the PC has detected the Vodafone 710 dial-up network service you can activate this service.

- 5** Install the *Vodafone Mobile Phone PC Assistant*. After inserting the CD, follow the prompts to complete the install.

To run the Vodafone 710 Dial-up Internet, follow these steps.

- 1** Run the Vodafone 710 Dial-up Internet on the PC. Click **OK**.
- 2** Select **Add** and then click **OK** to confirm.
- 3** Select the modem that is connected by Bluetooth.
- 4** Select **Vodafone Phone Connection** to make a dial-up connection.

#### ◆ Other Bluetooth Operations

You can execute the basic settings for the Bluetooth functions.

Select **Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth** for the following operations.

- Switch On/Off: Used to set the Bluetooth device to **On** or **Off**.
- Search new devices: Used to search for new Bluetooth devices.

- Devices: Used to view all detected Bluetooth devices.
- Visibility: Used to set whether your phone can be found by other devices when the Bluetooth function is enabled.
- Rename my device: Used to rename your phone.
- My device information: Used to view the detailed information of your phone, such as the device name and device address.

## USB

You can synchronise data between your phone and PC, surf the Internet with your phone and read the memory card by USB cable.



- To use USB cable, please strictly obey the following rules. Otherwise, your phone or PC may be damaged. To connect your phone with a PC through USB cable, first connect the USB connector to your phone, and then connect the other end of the cable to the PC. To disconnect your phone from the PC, first disable the

*Vodafone 710 MOBILE PHONE PC Assistant*, then disconnect the USB connector from the PC, and finally disconnect the USB cable from your phone.

- If the PC cannot recognise your phone when connecting through the USB cable, power off and restart the PC and then retry.
- Do not plug the USB cable in and out of your Vodafone 710 frequently.

### USB-Based Synchronisation

---

Your Vodafone 710 supports the synchronisation requests from a PC to your phone.

With USB cable and *Vodafone 710 MOBILE PHONE PC Assistant*, your phone can communicate with a PC. You can back up the contact entries and messages saved on your phone and the SIM card to a PC. You can also synchronise contacts, schedule events and To Do tasks between your phone and Outlook .

To operate the USB-based synchronisation with your phone, follow these steps.

- 1 Install the *Vodafone 710 MOBILE PHONE PC Assistant*. After inserting the CD, follow the guide to complete the install.
- 2 Select **Settings > Connectivity > Modem** from the main menu of your phone and set the port to **Modem via USB**.
- 3 Connect your phone and PC with the USB cable.
- 4 Run the *Vodafone 710 MOBILE PHONE PC Assistant* on the PC.
- 5 Now you can operate the synchronisation.

#### Note

### Accessing the Internet by USB

---

Connecting your phone and PC with the USB cable enables the PC to use the phone as a modem to establish a dial-up connection to the Internet.

To access the Internet by using the USB, two ways are available: use the *Vodafone 710 Mobile Phone PC Assistant* supplied with your Vodafone 710 or to use the Windows operating system to set the service.

**Note**

Only Windows 2000 and Windows XP are supported.

◆ **Using Vodafone 710 Mobile Phone PC Assistant to Access the Internet through USB Cable**  
To use the *Vodafone 710 Mobile Phone PC Assistant* supplied with your Vodafone 710 phone to access the Internet, follow these steps:

- 1 Select **Settings > Connectivity > Modem** and set the port to **Modem via USB**.
- 2 Install *Vodafone Mobile Phone PC Assistant*. After inserting the CD, follow the prompts to complete the install.
- 3 Connect your phone and PC with USB cable.
- 4 Confirm the USB device is shown in **Device Manager/Port** of your PC.

To run the Vodafone 710 Dial-up Internet, follow these steps.

- 1 Run the Vodafone 710 Dial-up Internet on the PC. Select **OK**.
- 2 Select **Add** and then press **OK** to confirm.
- 3 Select the USB port that is connected by USB cable.
- 4 Enter the information provided by the service provider for a dial-up connection in **Connect Setting** and then click **OK**.
- 5 Select **Vodafone Phone Connection** on your PC to create the dial-up connection.

◆ **Using Windows Operation System to Set the Function of Accessing the Internet with Your Phone**

You can also connect your phone and PC with the USB cable, and then use the Windows operating system to set the function of accessing the Internet by your phone.

- 1 Select **Settings > Connectivity > Modem** and set the port to **Modem via USB**.

## SD Card Reader

- 2 Install the *Vodafone 710 Mobile Phone PC Assistant*. After inserting the CD, follow the prompts to complete the install.
- 3 Connect your phone and PC with the USB cable.
- 4 Make sure that the USB modem is in the **Device manager/Modem** of your PC.
- 5 Select **Start > Control Panel > Network Connections** and then click **Create a new connect**. Then you can follow the guides to create a new connection.
- 6 Use the new connection to make the dial-up connection.

### SD Card Reader

You can read the files saved in the SD card by USB cable.

To use the SD card reader, follow these steps.

- 1 Insert the SD card to your phone.
- 2 Connect your phone and PC with the USB cable.

- 3 **Found New Hardware** is displayed on your PC, and an icon for the mobile memory drive appears.

#### Note

The function of SD card reader and the other functions using the USB cable are incompatible. If you enable the SD card reader, the other functions using the USB cable will become unavailable. If you need to recover the other USB functions, disable the card reader function.

### Note on Connection Functions

Some of the data connection functions of the Vodafone 710 cannot be used simultaneously. See the following chart for which features are supported.

# 16 DRM










Vodafone 710 supports "Forward Lock", "Combined delivery" and "Separated delivery" modes defined in OMA DRM1.0. Digital rights management (DRM) is the solution for preventing the digital contents from piracy and protecting the provider's interests. Here, the digital contents include Java applications and the multimedia contents such as image, audio and video. By attaching the copyright information, the file contents are protected by DRM. The DRM function controls the usages of these contents on terminals.


The attached copyright information may restrict the using times, using period and validity period in accessing the protected contents. If the protected content cannot be accessed, it indicates that the corresponding copyright is overdue or used up. You need to re-purchase the right for the DRM files in "Separated delivery" mode.

You can find out the copyright information by viewing the properties of the DRM files. You can also delete, switch and update the copyright.


The status of the files supported by the Vodafone 710 are listed as follows. The icon for the files protected

by "Forward lock" is the same as that for common files.

# 17 Settings

You can access the Settings screen by selecting  from the main menu.

## Phone Settings


You can change the settings of the phone, including Profiles, Phone language, Input language, Sound, Date and time, Date format, Shortcut, as well as Auto ON and OFF.

### Profiles

---

You can select different profiles for the phone to fit different environmental situations.


The Vodafone 710 provides profiles including **Normal**, **Meeting**, **Silent**, **Activity**, **Car**, **Headset**, **Offline**, **Sleep** and **My profile**.

You can select a profile and then press  or select **Options** > **On** to activate this profile. You can also select **Options** > **Edit** to edit the following settings for this profile.

- **Voice call tone:** To select the standard ringtones or the downloaded ringtones for incoming voice calls.

- **Video call tone:** To select the standard ringtones provided by the phone or select downloaded tones for incoming video calls.
- **Message tone:** To select the standard ringtones or the downloaded ringtones for new messages.
- **Tone volume:** To set the volume of incoming call rings and incoming message rings.
- **Earpiece volume:** To adjust the volume of the earpiece.
- **Key tone volume:** To adjust the volume for the keybeep.
- **Game volume:** To set the volume of the game.
- **Alert volume:** To set the volume of the prompt tone.
- **Vibration:** To enable or disable the vibration prompt mode.
- **Flip tone:** To set whether to make a sound when you open/close your phone.
- **Power On/Off tone:** To set whether to make a sound when you power your phone on/off.

#### Note

In the standby mode, you can press and hold  to switch the current profile to the

meeting profile. If the current profile is offline, you cannot execute this function.

### Phone Language

---

Your Vodafone 710 supports several languages. Select **Settings > Phone setup > Phone language** to select a language. Besides these languages, you can also select **Auto**. This option is used to set the phone language to be the same as that used in your SIM card.

### Input Language

---

The option is used to set the language used to enter text.

### Sound and Vibration

---

The option is used to change the settings for the normal profile.

#### Note

You can select **Phone setup > Profiles** to set the sounds for the phone.

### Date and Time

---

This option is used to change the system time for the phone.

### Date Format

---

This option is used to change the display format of the date of the phone. Three formats are available: **yy/mm/dd**, **mm/dd/yy**, **dd/mm/yy**.

### Shortcuts

---

This option is used to assign the most used functions to the scroll keys as shortcut keys.

### Auto ON and OFF

---

This option is used to set your phone to power on or off automatically.

- 1 In the **Auto ON** and **Auto OFF** screen, enable this function and set the cycle for **Auto On** and **Auto Off** respectively. Then select **Save**.
- 2 Set the time for **Auto On** and **Auto Off**, and then select **Option > Save** to save your settings.

## Display Settings

You can change the settings for the phone display.

### Wallpaper

---

You can select wallpaper and set the wallpaper layout for the home screen.

Your Vodafone 710 provides standard wallpaper for you to select. You can also select downloaded wallpaper by selecting **Download**.

### Brightness

---

This option is used to set the brightness of the screen.

### Keypad Backlight

---

This option is used to turn the keypad backlight on or off.

### Backlight Time

---

This option is used to set the backlight delay time for the screen. Four options are available: **5 seconds**, **15 seconds**, **30 seconds** and **Always on..**

### LCD Sleep Delay

---

This option is used to set the duration between backlight off and LCD off.

### Greeting Message

---

This option is used to enter a greeting message that appears on the screen when you power on your phone.

## Message Settings

You can change the message settings including SMS, MMS, Email, Push messages, Voice mail No. and Common phrase.

## Call Settings

You can change the settings for making calls.

### Call Forwarding


---


It is used to forward incoming calls.

- 1 In the main screen, select **Settings > Call setup > Call forwarding**.



## ■ Call Settings

- 2 Select the forwarding condition from **All calls**, **If out of reach**, **If busy**, and **If not answer**.
- 3 Then select the forwarding type from **Voice call**, **Fax call**, **Data call** and **All services**. You will have the following options:
  - Activate: Enter the forwarded-to number and press  to forward incoming call to this number.
  - Deactivate: Cancel call forwarding settings.
  - Check status: Check the status of call forwarding service.



Alternatively, you can select **Disable all** and then select one from the four items: **Voice call**, **Fax call**, **Data call** and **All services**. Then press  to disable all call forwarding services of this type.

### Call barring

---



It is used to set the call barring mode for the phone. Select **Call setup** > **Call barring** for the following options:

#### ◆ Barring outgoing calls:


- 1 Select the barring condition from **All outgoing calls**, **International calls**, and **International calls except home**.
- 2 Then select the barring type from **Voice call**, **Fax call**, **Data call**, and **All services**. You will have the following options:
  - Activate: Enter the call barring password and press  to enable this service.
  - Deactivate: Enter the call barring password and press  to disable this service.
  - Check status: Check the status of the call barring service.

#### ◆ Barring incoming calls:

- 1 Select the barring condition from **All incoming calls** and **Incoming calls when abroad**.
- 2 Then select the barring type from **Voice call**, **Fax call**, **Data call**, and **All services**. You will have the following options:

- **Activate:** Enter the call barring password and press  to enable this service.
- **Deactivate:** Enter the call barring password and press  to disable this service.
- **Check status:** Check the status of the call barring service

#### **Disable All**

Select one type from **Voice call**, **Fax call**, **Data call** and **All services**, and then enter the call barring password. Press  to cancel all call barring services of each type.

## **Call Waiting**

---

It is used to enable or disable the call waiting function. You can also view whether the call waiting function is enabled by checking the status.

The call waiting function is network-dependent. For more information, please consult Vodafone.

## **Auto Redial**

---

This function is used to auto redial the dialed number if the dialing failed.

## **Answer Mode**

---

It is used to set the mode for answering an incoming call. Three options are available: **Open flip**, **Any key** and **Send key**.

## **Auto answer**

---

It is used to select auto answering for incoming calls. Select **Call setup > Auto answer** for the following options.

- **Immediate answer:** To answer an incoming call immediately.
- **Message:** To auto send a text message that is pre-set and chosen from the "Common phrases" to the current caller.
- **Recorded message:** To answer an incoming call by auto playing a recorded message.
- **Disable:** To disable the auto answer function.

## **Calling ID**

---

With this function, you can select whether your phone number is shown on the called phone.

## ■ Video Call Settings

Select **Call setup** > **Calling ID**, and then you will have the following options.

- **Auto**: Whether your phone number will be shown on the called phone depends on the network.
- **Send**: Your phone number will be shown (if the network supports this service).
- **Hide**: Your phone number will not be shown (if the network supports this service).

### Select Line

---

It is used to set the call line for your phone. Two options are available: **Line 1** and **Line 2**.

### My Number

---


With this function, you can save your own phone numbers on the SIM card. You can select **Options** to edit or delete the records.

### Call Barring Password

---

This function is used to change the password for call barring.

Select **Call barring password** from the **Call setup** screen. Now you can change the call barring password.

- 1** Enter the old call barring password. (This is provided by your network operator if it is the first time for you to change the password.)
- 2** Enter a new call barring password.
- 3** Enter once again the new call barring password, and then press .

### Prompt to save

---

This function is used to prompt whether to save the number when there is an incoming call. You can enable or disable this function.

## Video Call Settings

You can change the settings for the Video Call function, including Picture in Picture, Switch display, Image quality, Forbid video, Forbid audio, Auto voice call, Send freeze image and Auto answer.

## Picture in Picture

---

During a video call, your image can be shown on your phone. You can select P-in-P function to arrange the positions of your image. You can also close your image window.

## Switch Display

---

During a video call, you can switch between image windows: to display your image in the small window and the other party's image in the large window, or display yours in the large window and the other party's in the small window.

## Image Quality

---

You can set the image quality for video. Two options are available: **Best quality** and **More smooth**.

## Forbid Video

---

You can open or close the video channel during a video call.

## Forbid Audio

---

You can open or close the audio channel during a video call.

## Auto Voice Call

---

If the other party's phone does not support the Video Call service, this function enables the phone to automatically switch to making a voice call.

## Send Freeze Image

---

The option is used to select a file and send it to the other party when you hold a video call.

## Auto Answer

---

This function is used to auto answer an incoming video call. You can enable or disable this function.

## Connectivity

The data connection function provides you with many data communication functions. You can synchronize data between your phone and a PC through a USB cable or Bluetooth. Your PC can use the built-in

modem of your phone to access the Internet. For detailed information, refer to "Connections" on page 76.

### Network Setup


You can change the settings for the network.

Select **Settings > Network** for following options: Mode, Network selection, Cell information, My public land mobile network (PLMN) list.

### Security Setup

You can change settings related to the phone security.

Select **Security** from **Settings**, and then enter the correct phone password if you have set the phone lock to **On** (the initial password is 0000). Then press


 to display the following security setting items:

#### Reset

This option is used to reset your phone to the factory settings.

## Password lock

This option is used to enable or disable the "Phone lock" and "PIN lock".

## Change password

You can modify the phone password and PIN code.

- 2 Select one item from **Change phone password, Change PIN, Change PIN2**.
- 3 Enter the old password (The initial phone password of the Vodafone 710 is 0000).
- 4 Enter a new password;
- 5 Enter the new password again to confirm.

**Note**

- To modify the PIN code, you must set the "PIN locked" to "On" first.
- If you enter the wrong PIN or PIN2 three times, the SIM card will be locked. You need the PUK or PUK2 code to unlock the SIM card. If you enter the wrong PUK or PUK2 code 10 times in total, the SIM card will be locked permanently.
- PUK or PUK2 code are delivered with the SIM card. If you do not have one or forget it, contact Vodafone service provider.

## Fixed Dialer Number

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If your SIM card supports the FDN (Fixed Dialer Number) function, you can set limits for phone numbers.

Select **Security > Fixed dialer number** for the following options.

- On: You can dial the numbers in the FDN list only. To enable this function, you need to enter the correct PIN2 code.
- Off: You can dial any number.
- FDN list: It is used to view the fixed dialer numbers. To create, edit or delete it, you need to enter the correct PIN2 code.

## DRM setting

## Fixed SIM card

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You use this function to unlock the phone with the operator. Before accessing the setting page, you need to enter the password. For the password and other information, contact your network provider.

# 18 Warnings and Precautions

## Electronic Device

Turn off your phone near high-precision electronic devices. The phone may affect the performance of these devices.

Such devices include hearing aids, pacemakers, fire alarm systems, automatic gates, and other automatic-control devices. Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15cm be maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this use the phone on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket. If you are using an electronic medical device, consult the device manufacturer to confirm whether the radio wave affects the operation of this device.

## Hospital

Pay attention to the following points in hospitals or health care facilities:

- Do not take your phone into the operating room (OR), intensive care unit (ICU), or coronary care unit (CCU).
- Do not use your phone at places for medical treatment where phone use is prohibited.

When using your phone near someone who is suffering from a heart disease, turn down the ringtone volume or vibration properly so that it does not affect the person.

## Area with Inflammables/Explosives

In any area with inflammables and explosives, turn off your phone and do not take out, install or charge the battery, to avoid the risk of causing either an explosion and a fire. Areas with inflammables and explosives include, but are not limited to:

- Petrol stations
- Areas for storing fuels (such as the bunk under the deck of a ship)
- Devices/Vehicles for transporting and storing fuels or chemical products
- Areas with chemical substances and particles (such as: granules, dust, metal powder) in the air

- Areas with the sign "Explosives"
- Areas with the sign "Turn off bi-directional wireless equipment"
- Areas where it is generally suggested to stop the engine or a vehicle

### Traffic Safety

- Please observe local laws and regulations on phone use. To avoid a traffic accident, do not use your phone while driving.
- Secure the phone in its holder. Do not place the phone on the seat or other places where it can come loose in a sudden stop or collision.
- Use the phone only when the vehicle is stopped in a safe place.
- If your phone supports the hands-free function, or the phone can be used with earphones, or there is any vehicle-mounted equipment with hands-free function, use only in emergency.
- Do not place the phone over the airbag or in the air bag outspread area. Otherwise, the phone may hurt you owing to the strong force when the airbag inflates.

- Observe the rules and regulations of airline companies. When boarding or approaching a plane, turn off the phone and take out the battery. In areas where phone use is prohibited, turn off the phone. Otherwise, the radio signal of the phone may disturb the plane control signals. Turn off your phone before boarding an aircraft.

### Storage Environment

- Do not place magnetic storage media such as magnetic cards and floppy disks near the phone. Radiation from the phone may erase the information stored on them.
- Do not put your phone, battery, or other accessories in containers with strong magnetic field, such as an induction cooker and a microwave oven. Otherwise, circuit failure, fire, or explosion may occur.
- Do not leave your phone, battery, or charger in a very hot or cold place. Otherwise, malfunction of the phone, fire, or explosion may occur.
- Do not place sharp metal objects such as pins near the earpiece. The earpiece may attract these objects and hurt you when you are using the phone.



## ■ Child Safety

- Do not subject your phone, battery, and charger to serious collision or shock. Otherwise, battery leakage, phone malfunction, overheating, fire, or explosion may occur.
- Do not put your phone in the back pocket of your trousers or skirt, to avoid damaging the phone while seated.
- Do not hold the phone to your ear when it rings or when you have switched on the handsfree function. Otherwise you risk serious permanent damage to your hearing.

## Child Safety

- Put your phone, battery, and charger in places out of the reach of children. Do not allow children to use the phone, battery, or charger without guidance.
- Do not allow children to put the battery in mouth, for electrolyte in the battery is poisonous.
- Do not allow children to touch the small fittings. Otherwise, if it is swallowed, one of these could get jammed in the gullet or cause suffocation.

## Operating Environment

- The phone, battery, and charger are not water-resistant. Keep them dry. Protect the phone, battery and charge from water or vapour. Do not touch the phone with a wet hand. Otherwise, short-circuiting and malfunction of the phone or electric shock may occur.
- Do not use the phone in dusty, damp and dirty places or places with a magnetic field. Otherwise, malfunction of the circuit may occur.
- Protect your phone from moisture and humidity.
- Do not turn the phone on or off when it is near your ears to avoid negative impact on your health.
- When carrying or using the phone, keep the antenna at least 0,6 inch (1,5 centimeters) away from your body, to avoid negative impact on your health caused by radio frequency leakage.
- If you feel uncomfortable (such as feeling sick or queasy) after playing games on your phone for a long time, please go to see a doctor immediately.
- On a day with thunderstorms, do not use your phone outdoors or when it is being charged.

- Do not touch the antenna when a call is going on. Touching the antenna may affect call quality and cause the phone to operate with more power. As a result, the talk time and standby time are shortened.
- The phone may interfere with nearby TV sets, radios and PCs.
- In accordance with international standards for radio frequency and radiation, use phone accessories approved by the manufacturer only.


### Cleaning and Maintenance

- Before you clean or maintain the phone, turn off the phone and disconnect it from the charger. Otherwise, electric shock or short-circuiting of the battery or charger may occur.
- Do not use any chemical detergent, powder, or other chemical agent (such as alcohol and benzene) to clean the phone and the charger. Otherwise, part damage or a fire can be caused. We recommend cleaning the phone and the charger with a piece of soft antistatic cloth that is a little wet.

- Do not scratch the shell of the phone. Otherwise, the shed coating may cause skin allergy. Once it happens, stop using the phone at once and go to see a doctor.
- Keep the plug dry when you clean it, to prevent fire.
- If the phone or any of its fittings does not work, turn to the local authorized service center for help.

### Environmental Protection

Please observe the local regulations regarding the disposal of your packaging materials, exhausted battery and old phone and please promote their recycling. Do not dispose of an exhausted battery or old phone in municipal waste.

 This symbol indicates that the equipment carrying this mark must NOT be thrown into general waste but should be collected separately and properly recycled under local regulations.

## ■ Emergency Call

### Emergency Call

You can use your phone for emergency calls. However, connections cannot be guaranteed in all conditions. You should never rely solely on a mobile phone for essential communications.

### Battery

- Use the battery approved by the manufacturer only. Otherwise, it may explode.
  - Do not dispose of the battery in fire. Otherwise, the battery may ignite or explode.
  - Do not expose the battery to extreme temperatures, never above +60°C (+140°F).
  - Do not connect the two poles of the battery with conductors such as cables, jewellery or any other metal material. Otherwise, the battery will be short-circuited and it may burn your body.
  - Do not disassemble the battery or solder the battery poles. Otherwise fluid leakage, overheating, fire, or explosion may occur.
- If there is battery leakage, smoke, or strange smell, stop using the battery and keep it away from open flame to avoid fire or explosion. Then consult an authorized maintenance engineer for help.
  - If the battery fluid contacts your skin or cloth, wash with clean water immediately to avoid irritation to the skin.
  - The battery is not fully charged when delivered. Plug the charger cable into the bottom of the phone, plug the power supply unit into a mains power socket and charge for at least two hours. You can only charge the battery in a temperature range of +5°C to 45°C.
  - If the battery fluid gets into eyes, do not rub your eyes. Otherwise, your eyes can be hurt. Wash with clean water and refer to a doctor immediately.
  - If there is battery deformation, colour change or abnormal heating while you charge or store the battery, take it out immediately and stop using it. Otherwise, battery leakage, overheating, explosion, or fire may occur.

- When installing the battery, do not push the battery by force lest battery fluid leak out or the battery crack.
- Do not remove the battery while the phone is turned on.
- If you have not used the battery for a long time, charge it and then store it at normal temperature.

### Charger

- Use only the charger approved by the phone manufacturer. Any violation of this rule may result in fire or malfunction of the charger.
  - Do not short-circuit the charger. Short-circuiting the charger may cause fire or malfunction of the charger.
  - If the power cord is damaged (for example, the lead is exposed or broken), or the plug becomes loose, stop using the power cord at once. Otherwise, electric shock, short-circuiting of the charger, or fire may occur.
  - Keep the charger dry. If water or other liquid leaks into the charger, electrical leakage or other faults may occur.
- Do not use the charger in a dusty or damp environment.
  - Keep the power cord away from any heating appliance.
  - Ensure the charger is plugged into the power socket when charging the battery. Improper insertion may result in electric shock, fire, or explosion. To unplug the charger, pull the plug out rather than yanking the power cord.
  - Use the AC power supply defined in the specifications of the charger. An improper power voltage can cause fire or malfunction of the charger.
  - Do not place any heavy object on the power cord of the charger. Do not damage, change, or pluck the power cord. Otherwise, electric shock or fire may occur.
  - When you are charging the battery with the charger, do not touch the plug, power cord or the charger with a wet hand. Otherwise, electric shock can be caused.
  - If any liquid such as water leaks into the charger, remove the plug of the charger from the socket

immediately. Otherwise, overheating, fire and other malfunction may occur.

### Using the USB Cable

To use the USB cable, please strictly obey the following rules. Otherwise, your phone or PC may be damaged:

- To connect your phone and PC with the USB cable, first connect to the phone, and then connect to the PC.
- During the process of communication between your phone and PC, it is strictly forbidden to plug in or pull out the USB cable.
- To disconnect your phone and PC from the USB cable, disconnect from PC first, and then disconnect from the phone.

### Rules for Exposure to RF Energy

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed

by the independent scientific organization ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to assure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg and the highest SAR value for this device when tested at the ear was 0.663 W/kg\*. As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body. In this case, the highest tested SAR value is 0.422 W/kg\*\*.

As SAR is measured utilizing the devices highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum level required to reach the network.

The World Health Organization has stated that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for the use of mobile devices. They note that if you want to reduce your exposure then you can do so by limiting the length of

calls or using a 'hands-free' device to keep the mobile phone away from the head and body.
